JESSE W. LOCKE
2000-2001**

We are honored that you have taken time out of your busy schedules to be with us. To those who are visiting with us from other Grand Jurisdictions, I extend to you and your lady a warm and cordial welcome. We hope your stay with us will be both pleasant and fraternal. Enjoy yourself. If you have any special needs, please let us know and it will be our pleasure to respond.

To the Sir Knights of Alabama, I personally thank you for being here to assist in carrying on the business of this great organization. I encourage you to take an active part in our deliberations and sincerely hope you will be inspired by the discussions and actions taken here, and go back to your respective York Rite Bodies and make 2001 the greatest year ever for Masonry in Alabama.

How well I have performed the duties entrusted to me is for you to decide. I trust that in some way you can forgive me the errors made and hopefully nothing I did caused any unjust reflections on this great Fraternity.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

I wish I could report favorably on membership this year. Unfortunately, that is not the case. In spite of Crusade 2000 we experienced a loss in total membership. Some Commanderies are healthy, and interest and participation is good. They opened their Bodies according to the ritual. Others are suffering from acute lack of interest, poor attendance and little or no ritualistic work. Some don't even bother to open.

Life Sponsors of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation remain at 100%

Our ritualistic work, for the most part, is good. We held several one and two day festivals on the local level in different parts of the State during the year, which is very good and shows an increase in membership. We must continue making a special effort to reduce our N.P.D.'s. These Sir Knights had an interest once upon a time - we must rekindle the fire that burned in their hearts and York Rite Masonry will rise once again. We must work much harder in our recruiting now that the Imperial Shrine has eliminated us from their accounts.

NECROLOGY

Although we are saddened by the loss of our Past Grand Commander Anthony V. Jannett and the resignation of our Grand Senior Warden Anthony M. Deming, we must be thankful to our Heavenly Father that our Grand Commandery line has remained almost unbroken this year. The Grand Prelate will have account of those Sir Knights who have been called before the Great White Throne.

DISPENSATIONS GRANTED

I have authorized several dispensations this year, mostly for voting out of statutory time, for the benefit of the Grand Commandery.

I have reviewed the accompanying statement of financial position - cash basis of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 2000, and the related statement of activities - cash basis for the year then ended, in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. All information included in these financial statements is the representation of the management of the Commandery.

A review consists principally of inquiries of personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data. It is substantially less in scope than an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, I do not express such an opinion.

Such information has been subjected to the inquiry and analytical procedures applied in the review of the basic financial statements, and I am not aware of any material modifications that should be made thereto.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 2000

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Commandery is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

NOTE 3 - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS:

First Annual Conclave was held in Montgomery, Alabama on Friday, November 30, 1860

Grand Commandery Office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder in 1962

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1963, Earl D. Holmes was elected and installed as Grand Commander, but he died before he could serve.

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder, Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus, and the Annual

Conclave date was changed from April each year, to the last Monday in February to correspond with Grand Chapter and Grand Council.

As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.

On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 3621 South Fifth Avenue, Birmingham.

In September, 1979, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 5504 1/2 North First Avenue, Birmingham, 35212.

On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon who resigned.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer, Emeritus.

On September 1, 1991, Thomas W. Mann and James A. Kile resigned as Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer. Arthur C. Harding was appointed as Grand Recorder and Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was appointed as Grand Treasurer.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1992, Arthur C. Harding was elected Grand Recorder and Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was elected Grand Treasurer. Thomas W. Mann was elected as Grand Recorder Emeritus and James A. Kile was elected as Grand Treasurer Emeritus.

On June 23, 1997, Past Grand Commander Robert L. Byars, Jr. renounced York Rite Masonry and is no longer a member.

On January 13, 1999 the Grand York Rite Office moved to 3430 Ratliff Road, Irondale, AL 35210

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
