REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Alabama:

We your committee on Finance, wish to submit the following report as well as a proposed budget for the year 2002 for your review and consideration.

We have examined the Review as completed by William M. Tate, C.P.A. of the Grand Commandery and recommend that it be accepted.

The annual budget was prepared by the combined efforts of this committee as well as the R. E. Grand Commander, Grand Treasurer and the Grand Recorder.

After a lengthy discussion regarding the fact that the budget proposed was a deficit budget and a revised budget which would be within the anticipated income was not acceptable to the membership, the following motion was made from the floor.

An assessment in the amount of \$2.00 per member for the current year only payable with the semi-annual report due on June 1, 2002. This assessment is levied against the Constituent Commanderies based on the total membership as shown on the June 1st semi-annual report.

This motion passed with a unanimous vote.

After this motion was passed, the original budget proposed by the Finance Committee was brought to a vote and was accepted by the membership. Budget accepted by the membership is attached to this report.

ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT

I have reviewed the accompanying statement of financial position - cash basis of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 2001, and the related statement of activities - cash basis for the year then ended, in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. All information included in these financial statements is the representation of the management of the Commandery.

A review consists principally of inquiries of personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data. It is substantially less in scope than an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, I do not express such an opinion.

Based on my review, I am not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A.

My review was made for the purpose of expressing limited assurance that there are no material modifications that should be made to the financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A. The information in the accompanying schedule of expenses - cash basis is presented only for supplementary analysis purposes. Such information has been subjected to the inquiry and analytical procedures applied in the review of the basic financial statements, and I am not aware of any material modifications that should be made thereto.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2001

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Commandery is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

NOTE 3 - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS:

Temporarily restricted net assets are reserved to cover expenses for specified officers to attend the Triennial Meeting, as well as other expenses for the past Grand Officer and for the Southern Breakfast. During the year an additional \$675.00 was designated as a transfer from unrestricted net assets to temporarily restricted assets, increasing the temporarily restricted net assets from \$3,050.00 to \$3,725.00.

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

For the past several years, my reports have been quite downbeat; although I have had in past years submissions from across the state, I have always felt that there could be more from other Commanderies. This year, for the first time in several years, I looked at how much material had been run against the filler material I have had to use. This was because I have been encouraged by submissions over the last twelve months. I'm happy to report that six Commanderies have furnished me material - and a seventh has furnished material for the April issue. Huntsville, Birmingham, Anniston, Montgomery, Mobile and Monroeville have provided articles, and Tuscaloosa sent me a couple of articles only in the last week or so.

Although a little over 40 per cent of the articles have had to be filler, well over half the material provided to the Sir Knights has been news from Templary across the state. REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION

To the Grand Commander, Grand Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

It is always a problem making this report to you each year because it is so difficult to determine exactly how much each Commandery in Alabama contributes to the Eye Foundation from the information that is sent from the Grand Encampment. Alabama's donation to the $33^{\rm rd}$ Annual Voluntary Campaign was \$12,991.10. Of the 50 states we were number 26 in giving. We are one of the few states that is 100\$ Life Sponsorship and we manage to stay 100% mainly because of money that was left for the purpose of keeping us 100% by Past Grand Commander Ray Rutledge who, through his generosity, made us 100% to begin with. Unfortunately we have some Commanderies that are not making an effort to donate anything to the charity. We need more Commanderies like Anniston that donated more than \$10.00 per member and DeMolay that donated more than \$5.00 per member to the last Campaign.

Following is breakdown by Commandery of monies expended for eye surgeries they sponsored this past year.

The total expenditures for eye surgery in Alabama since last years report was \$443,270.00. We expended \$139,245.00 more in 2001 than we did in 2000. Montgomery alone expended \$86,305.00 more in 2001 than they did in 2000.

It is interesting to note that Cyrene No 10 and Woodlawn No 31 with 38.7% of the membership expended 25.4% of the total while Tuscaloosa No. 13 and Montgomery No. 4 with 10.5% of the membership expended 49% of the total. Anniston No. 23, that donated more than \$10.00 per member, only expended 3.2% of the total.

Two things that those of you who investigate these candidates for eye surgery should be reminded of. First, the candidate must be a citizen of the United States, and second, assistance should only be given to a candidate as a last resort, that is, after a sincere effort has been made to find other sources for assistance.
