#### INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

Mr. Erskine K. Smith Most Illustrious Grand Master Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama Birmingham, Alabama

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and fund balance - cash basis of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 1991, and the related statements of revenue and expenses - cash basis and of changes in fund balance - cash basis for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, the Council prepares its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements except that the statements include an inventory of supplies held for resale as well as a provision for depreciation of fixed assets. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and fund balance of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama as of December 31, 1991, and its revenue and expenses and the changes in its fund balance for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1991

#### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

#### A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

#### B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the firstin, first-out method, or market.

#### C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

#### NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Council is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

I have had the pleasure for many years of serving on various committees with Companion Morgan and he always served with distinction. He will be greatly missed by all. The youth organization of this state, the Order of DeMolay and the Order of the Rainbow for Girls, are not fairing well. Both Orders continue to struggle for survival and at times it seems as though their sponsoring bodies have little desire to help keep them operating. Fortunately there are still a few dedicated individuals who continue to work for our youth but not nearly enough. Apparently, because the Masonic Fraternity is experiencing hard times concerning the loss of membership, the lodges and Eastern Star chapters that sponsor our youth cannot be concerned with the state of affairs and our Rainbow assemblies and DeMolay chapters and choose to neglect their needs, even to the point of allowing them to fold without making an effort to keep them active.

In 1979 the Order of Rainbow in Alabama had 27 active assemblies and several hundred members. Now there are 6 active assemblies and 189 members. It is certain that similar figures would be consistent with the DeMolay chapters. What a shame it would be to lose these assemblies and chapters at a time when the principles they teach are so badly needed by the youth of our nation. Won't you please do what you can to assist?
