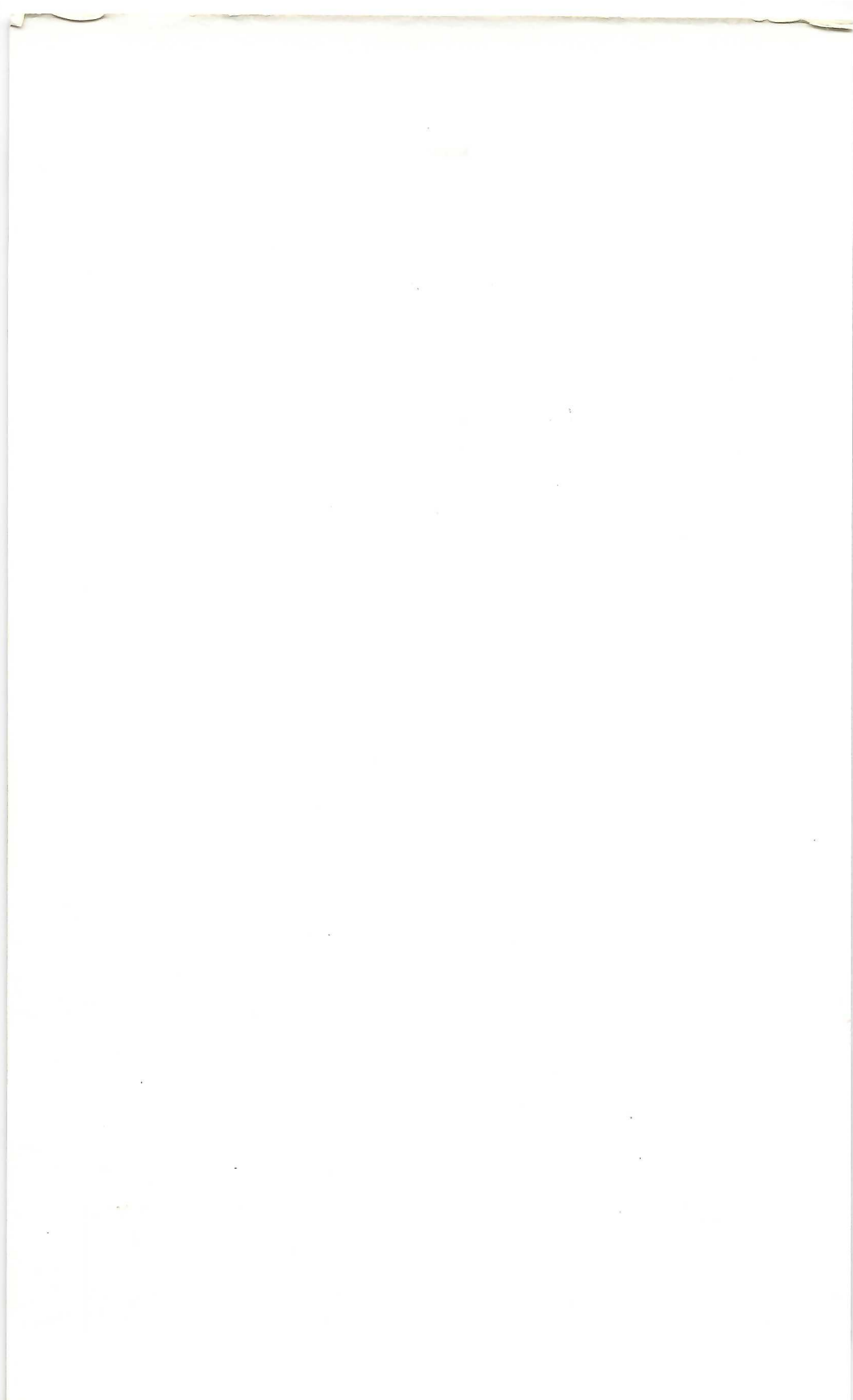

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and fund balance - cash basis of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 1991, and the related statements of revenue and expenses - cash basis and of changes in fund balance - cash basis for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Council's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, the Council prepares its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements except that the statements include an inventory of supplies held for resale as well as a provision for depreciation of fixed assets. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and fund balance of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama as of December 31, 1991, and its revenue and expenses and the changes in its fund balance for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS  
DECEMBER 31, 1991

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Council is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

**REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RITUALISTIC WORK**

*To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Grand Officers, and Companions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama:*

We, the members of the Grand Council Committee on Capitular work, report the following:

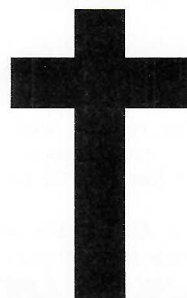

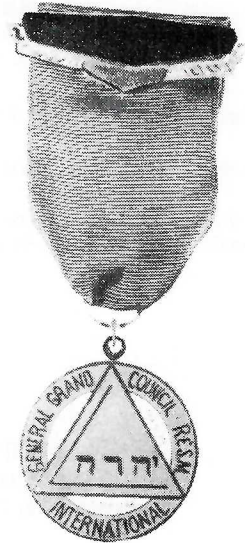

- l.....On December 1, 1960, Companion Verna A. Rushton was appointed Grand Recorder to succeed Gordon L. Ewalt who resigned.
- m.....Grand York Rite Office was moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder
- n.....At the Annual Assembly, February, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus.
- o.....Annual Assembly date changed to last Monday in February
- p.....As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite Unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.
- q.....On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to new location at 3621 South 5th Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35222.
- r.....On October 1, 1979, the Grand York rite Office was moved to a new location at 5504 1/2 North 1st Avenue Birmingham, Alabama 35212.
- s.....On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyd McClendon who resigned.
- t.....At the Annual Assembly, February, 1981, Hoyd McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.
- u.....On September 1, 1991, Companion Thomas W. Mann and Companion James A. Kile resigned and Most Illustrious Companion Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was appointed as Grand Treasurer and Companion Arthur C. Harding was appointed as Grand Recorder.
- v.....At the Annual Assembly in February, 1992, Companion Thomas W. Mann was elected as Grand Recorder Emeritus and Most Illustrious Past Grand Master (Honorary). Companion James A. Kile was elected Grand treasurer Emeritus. Most Illustrious Companion Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was elected Grand Treasurer and Companion Arthur C. Harding was elected Grand Recorder.
