Address of the Most Illustrious Grand Master Maurice C. Himes 1993 - 1994

To the Officers, Past Illustrious Grand Masters, Companions, and Distinguished Visitors to the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama.

Welcome to our 156th Annual Assembly. We are justly proud of our State, the City of Dothan, and the Wiregrass Area. So if there is anything that we can do to make your visit more interesting, rewarding, or enjoyable, please do not hesitate to contact me or one of my officers for any assistance.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

I am both happy and very sad to make this final address to you, my brethren of the Grand Council of Alabama. Happy that I was given the opportunity to make the acquaintance of York Rite Masons all over this country and to represent this Grand Council to them in, hopefully, a manner that reflected favorably on the York Rite in Alabama and that would meet with your approval. I shall be eternally grateful to you for setting my feet on this path five years ago by electing me to this Grand Council.

I am sad to be leaving this office because there was just not enough time to accomplish in one short year as many things as I wanted to get done.

We continue to be plagued by loss of membership, as is nearly everyone else in the states I visited, and I am as much at a loss as to the solution as everyone else with whom I discussed it. However, there were several things I noticed in states where the York Rite was strong and thriving. Most notable was that they invariably had a close and strong working relationship with the Grand Lodge.

I feel that we must return to the many and varied aspects of Freemasonry that have made this great fraternity endure for so many decades. We seem to have lost our standing in the community and business world, and no longer are an organization to which many men aspire to become a member. We tell ourselves and our prospective members that we are the oldest fraternal organization in the world, and then, too often, show this same new member that his standing and worth will be judged by his proficiency in the ritual. If he has neither the time nor inclination to become active in ritual work, he soon realizes that this is nearly the only social and fraternal opportunity we offer him. Ultimately, the only enduring and truly valuable reward of Masonry, aside from the charity we support, is the respect and friendships you make among your local companions, those throughout the state, and even those in other states throughout this country. To this end, I recommend to every officer in this Grand Council line to begin your travel to as many other jurisdictions as you can, as early as you can, so that when you visit as a presiding officer, you are known and respected as a longtime friend rather than as a stranger.

ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT

We have reviewed the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and fund balance - cash basis of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 1993, and the related statements of revenue and expenses - cash basis and of changes in fund balance - cash basis for the year then ended, in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. All information included in these financial statements is the representation of the management of the Council.

A review consists principally of inquiries of personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data. It is substantially less in scope than an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A.

Our review was made for the purpose of expressing limited assurance that there are no material modifications that should be made to the financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A. The information in the accompanying Schedule l is presented only for supplementary analysis purposes. Such information has been subjected to the inquirv and analytical procedures applied in the review of the basic financial statements. This information is presented on the cash basis of accounting, and we are not aware of any material modifications that

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1993

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. <u>Inventories</u>

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Council is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.


