On September 1, 2004, the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Right Eminent Grand Commander Roger Simmons, Companion Sterling Hughes, Floyd Hambrick, Joe Pace, James Anders and myself were present.

On October 6, 2004, we again visited Scottsboro. The Most Worshipful Grand Master, Darrell Neill, Roger Simmons, Myself and

four other Companion met.

On December 1, 2004, eleven Companions of Jackson-DeKalb, James Anders and myself met and discussed the future of Jackson-DeKalb York Rite Bodies. I gave them Special Dispensation to elect and install officers out of statutory time on January 5, 2005.

On January 5, 2005, we again went to Jackson-DeKalb and met with nine members. We elected and installed officers and had a most enjoyable meeting. The Companions promised to help in any way they could to keep Jackson-DeKalb active.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2004

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and were depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Council is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32.

NOTE 3 - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS:

Temporarily restricted net assets are reserved to cover expenses for specified officers to attend the Triennial Meeting. During the year there were no increases or decreases in this reserve account and the balance remained at \$2,025.00.

Proposition to Amend the By-Laws of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama

Whereas, Article X, Section 18 of the By-Laws now allows for membership in only one Council within this jurisdiction, and

Whereas, there are members within this jurisdiction that desire to hold dual membership in other subordinate Councils within this jurisdiction and in the interest of allowing individuals to contribute more to the good of our subordinate Councils, therefore

Be it Resolved, that Article X Section 18 be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

DUAL MEMBERSHIP:

Section 18: A Companion can be a member of two Councils in this Grand Jurisdiction, provided both Councils record him as a dual member; and his membership is reported to the Grand Council. However; a dual member cannot hold elected office in both Councils at the same time. Any matter that affects membership in either Council will likewise affect membership in both Councils. Furthermore, it is permissible for a Companion in this Jurisdiction to hold membership another Grand Jurisdiction, provided said other Jurisdictionis in fraternal relations with this Grand Jurisdiction, and further provided that said other Grand Jurisdiction legalizes dual membership. Likewise, a Companion of another Grand Jurisdiction that qualifies as above who properly applies and is duly elected can become a dual member of a subordinate Council in this Grand Jurisdiction with all rights and obligations of regular membership.

Should a Companion holding dual membership within Alabama desire to withdraw his membership from one Council, he shall notify the Council from which he desire to withdraw his membership of his decision in writing, and if he has paid current dues and no charges are pending against him, the Secretary of the Council will carry him as withdrawn and notify the other Council in which dual membership was held of the date that the member is no longer a dual member. A Companion holding membership in Alabama and another Grand Jurisdiction may continue as long as the Companion remains in good standing in his basic (HOME) Council, however, any matter affecting the basic membership will also affect the dual membership.

CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

The Chairman of the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation, Jack C. Wade yielded the floor to Maurice C. "Bud" Himes, Deputy General Grand Master of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Mason, International to present some awards and to give a short report on the Foundation.

The Foundation is now engaging in extensive stem cell research. The source of many of these stem cells i9 from body fat which is removed and placed in a centrifuge. These cells can then be injected back into the individuals body placing them right where they need to be thereby eliminating a rejection problem. Using this method they are finding that a by-pass can be grown with these stem cells around a blockage which has occurred in an artery.

A total of \$2,635.00 was received from nine of the local councils, Knight Masons Council #22 and including donations of \$100 from Companion Robert Crawford and a total of \$560 from the York Rite Ladies Craft Sales.

This Grand Council was concluded with prayer to reconvene at eleven A.M., Tuesday for open installation of the Grand Officers.


INSTALLATION OF GRAND COUNCIL OFFICERS FOR 20054 - 20065

PERSONAL HISTORY


Companion Scarborough was born March 29, 1933 in Irondale, Alabama, the son of Alva Lawrence and Era Mildred Scarborough. He had two brothers, William and Claude, and two sisters, Sue and Juanita. Companion Scarborough moved to Mobile during World War II so that his father could work in the shipyards building warships for the war effort. He attended Vigor High School and left school early to join the Navy where he proudly served for 16 years in the Seabees. He married Sandra Acree, his wife of 48 years on February 9, 1957. In 1959 they had a daughter born to them, Leigh Anne, followed two years later by another daughter, Rhonda. Fourteen years went by when they were graced with the birth of Ron, Jr. Two years later they were blessed with a son, Robert, and a year after that another son, Daniel.

Companion Scarborough retired from Dixie Neon Sign Company of Birmingham in 1982 as a sign maker. One of his most famous signs is the star and letters on top of Caraway Hospital in Birmingham. After retirement he was active in the Boy Scouts with his sons and worked with the Mission of Mercy in Birmingham which helped cloth and feed the homeless and less fortunate in the Birmingham area.
