ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT

We have reviewed the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and fund balance - cash basis of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 1994, and the related statements of revenue and expenses - cash basis and changes in fund balance - cash basis for the year then ended, in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. All information included in these financial statements is the representation of the management of the Commandery.

A review consists principally of inquiries of personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data. It is substantially less in scope than an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A.

Our review was made for the purpose of expressing limited assurance that there are no material modifications that should be made to the financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A. The information in the accompanying Schedule 1 is presented only for supplementary analysis purposes. Such information has been subjected to the inquiry and analytical procedures applied in the review of the basic financial statements. This information is presented on the cash basis of accounting, and we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made thereto.

DECEMBER 31, 1994

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. <u>Inventories</u>

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Commandery is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON DeMOLAY

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

During the past year DeMolay has drastically declined in Alabama, especially in membership. We lost two Chapters, Etowah in Gadsden and Gilbertown. Further we lost members because we did not initiate new members as we should have because of declining interest. Our young men lost interest because of inactivity. We were inactive because of lack of quality adult leadership. We desperately need each of you to take an active interest in our Youth Organizations.

DeMolay is a youth organization sponsored by the Masonic fraternity. In forming a DeMolay Chapter it is necessary to have ten Master Masons sign a Resolution to Sponsor. Any Masonic affiliated organization may sponsor a Chapter. A Chapter must have at least three Advisors or adult leaders. They may be Senior DeMolays, those DeMolays who have reached their twenty-first birthday, or Master Masons. Some jurisdictions, outside Alabama, allow adult leaders or Advisors who are not members of the Masonic fraternity.

This Grand Commandery is the sponsor of the Gordon L. Evatt Memorial Priory, an organization for those DeMolays who have reached the age of seventeen. Membership has been so low that they have been unable to meet except when DeMolay has their Fall Session immediately prior to Grand Lodge. There has not been an officer of this Grand Commandery in attendance for so long no one cares to remember the exact date. That my brethren is pitiful.

Everyone within the Masonic Fraternity has his plate full as the responses go when asked for help with our youth organizations. My Brethren there is a crisis in our nation, our state and in the community in which each of us lives, the decline of our youth. Our youth are our greatest resource, our salvation. It is high time we quit complaining, griping and whining about how much we have to do. We must do it ourselves. And if we cannot, or will not, then we must elicit the help of someone who will help with our youth. We must support them more with our time, even if it is a small amount of time.

Who of you can say when the last time was that you put your arm around one of our DeMolay boys and told him how proud you were of him, for what he had done or for just being a member of DeMolay, the finest youth organization in the world! When was the last time you spoke to one of the Advisors of a DeMolay Chapter and told him how much you appreciate what he is doing for the youth organization that you sponsor, for giving the time in your place that you do not have to give.

Words are meaningless if they do not invoke thought that causes a response. It is our prayer to almighty God that these words of truth will evoke in you a positive response before it is too late and DeMolay is gone in Alabama. It is up to you. We may be preaching to the choir. But, just maybe, the choir will tell a friend or at least one of their dedicated Masonic Brothers that their youth organization desperately needs their help.

To the Grand Commander, Grand Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

The Order of the Rainbow for Girls in Alabama continues to struggle for survival like so many of our Masonic organizations are doing. The terrific loses that we are sustaining in our Grand Lodges are affecting the nucleus from which Rainbow has to obtain its members as it is with most of our appendant and concordant organizations. Rainbow has adjusted its requirement for membership in an effort to overcome its losses but so far, it too, has failed to come up with a solution to its losses. A few years ago Supreme Assembly lowered the age requirement from 12 years of age to 11 years of age for membership, they started allowing underage girls to become pledges, and they started allowing the mothers and fathers of non-masonic members to observe the initiation ceremonies and attend the meetings. Still this has not helped increase, or even keep in check, the numbers in membership of the Assemblies.

While there are few Assemblies that are still maintaining a respectable membership most are not. Even the strongest Assemblies do not have the membership that they once had and many of the Assemblies that were once very large have gone defunct.

Whether or not Rainbow is going to survive this present trend is uncertain but one thing for sure is, that if it does not, the masons of this state will have to share part of the responsibility for its demise.

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama.

The following resolution is submitted for your consideration:

WHEREAS the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama is required to pay per capita tax to the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States each year in the amount of three dollars and thirty cents (\$3.30) for each Knight Templar on our rolls and

WHEREAS the per capita tax in Alabama has not been increased since 1986 and

WHEREAS the membership in Alabama has decreased by over 1,300 Knights Templar resulting in a decrease in per capita tax income of approximately \$10,500 per year since 1986 and

WHEREAS interest income has decreased approximately 60% during this same period while budgeted expenses have remained approximately the same.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Section 9 (3) (a) and (3) (b) of the Constitution be replaced as follows:

Section 9 (3) (a) For each Knight Templar borne upon the rolls at the date of the annual return, Ten Dollars (\$10.00) which shall include the Grand Encampment Per Capita Tax.

(3) (b) Any future increase in the Per Capita Tax levied by the Grand Encampment of the United States will automatically be added to the amount levied in (3) (a) above effective with the first annual return submitted by the subordinate Commandery to the Grand Recorder after the adoption of such increase by the Grand Encampment of the United States.

WHEREAS the membership in Alabama has decreased by over 1,300 Knights Templar since 1986 resulting in a decrease in per capita tax income of approximately \$10,500 per year and

WHEREAS interest income has decreased approximately 60% during this same period while budgeted expenses have remained approximately the same.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Article II, Section 10 of the Constitution be amended by deleting the following paragraph:

All members of the Standing Committees shall be allowed mileage for attending the Annual Conclave of this Grand Commandery at the rate of

ten cents per mile round trip from their home to the city in which the Annual Conclave is held and the same per diem as allowed by the Finance Committee to the elected Grand Commandery Officers.



First Annual Conclave was held in Montgomery, Alabama on Friday, November 30, 1860

Grand Commandery Office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder in 1962

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1963, Earl D. Holmes was elected and installed as Grand Commander, but he died before he could serve.

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder, Thomas w. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus, and the Annual Conclave date was changed from April each year, to the last Monday in February to correspond with Grand Chapter and Grand Council.

As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.

On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 3621 South Fifth Avenue, Birmingham.

In September, 1979, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 5504 1/2 North First Avenue, Birmingham, 35212.

On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon who resigned.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Gmand Treasurer, Emeritus.

On September 1, 1991, Thomas W. Mann and James A. Kile resigned as Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer. Arthur C. Harding was appointed as Grand Treasurer. Recorder and Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was appointed as Grand Treasurer.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1992, Arthur C. Harding was elected Grand Recorder and Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was elected Grand Ireasurer. Thomas W. Mann was elected as Grand Recorder Emeritus and James A. Kile was elected as Grand Ireasurer Emeritus.

CHRONOLOGY

Titles of Meetings and Dates of Bodies Composed Exclusively of Masons.

The ordinary Calendar, or vulgar era, is not generally used by Freemasons in dating their official documents. The have one peculiar to themselves, differing according to their various Rites.

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS in all parts of the World, add 4,000 years to the Christian era, calling it Anno Lucis-Year of Light; abbreviated A.L. (This fact has a symbolic reference, not because they believe Freemasonry is, but that the principles and light of the institution are coeval with the creation. (See below.) F&AM Lodges hold "Communications."

ROYAL ARCH MASONS date from the building of the second Temple-530 B.C. Their style is, therefore, Anno Inventionis-A. Inv.- in the year of the discovery. Royal Arch Chapters hold "Convocations."

ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS date from the completion of Solomon's Temple 1000 B.C. Their style is Anno Depositionis-A. Dep.-year of Deposit. Royal and Select Councils hold "Assemblies." Their style is Anno Depositionis-A. Dep.-in the

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR date from the organization of the Order in 1118 A.D. Their style is, therefore, Anno Ordinia-A.O.-in the year of the Order. Knight Templar Commanderies hold "Conclaves."

ORDER OF THE HIGH PRIESTHOOD dates from the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchezadak, which occurred 1914 B.C. Their style is Anno Benedistionis-A.B.-in the year of the Blessing. Anointed High Priest hold "Convocations."

ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE MASONS use the Jewish Calendar, which adds 3760 to the Christian era, styled Anno Mundi-A.M.-year of the World. Or, they sometimes use the Hebrew year which begins on the seventeenth of September, or feast of Tisri, using the initials A.H.-Anno Hebraico.

MYSTIC SHRINE; TEMPLES, A.A.O.N. Each thirty years from the Hejira, or July 15th, A.D. 602 constitutes a cycle. Nineteen of these years contain 355 days, Eleven, 356.

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS - Add 4,000 years.

Thus: 1995 + 4,000 = A.L. 5995

ROYAL ARCH MASONS - Add 530 years.

Thus: 1995 + 530 = A..Inv. 2525

ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS - Add 1,000 years.

Thus: 1995 +1,000 years = A. Dept. 2995

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR - Subtract 1,118 years.

Thus: 1995 - 1,118 = A.O. 877

ORDER OF HIGH PRIESTHOOD - Add 1,913 years.

Thus 1995 + 1,913 = A.B. 3,908

SCOTTISH RITE MASONS - Add 3,760 years.

Thus: 1995 + 3,760 = A.M. 5755
