ACCOUNTANT'S REPORT

Mr. Bobby R. Terry Right Eminent Grand Commander Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama Birmingham, Alabama

I have reviewed the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and fund balance - cash basis of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 1998, and the related statements of revenue and expenses - cash basis and changes in fund balance - cash basis for the year then ended, in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services issued by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. All information included in these financial statements is the representation of the management of the Commandery.

A review consists principally of inquiries of personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data. It is substantially less in scope than an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements taken as a whole. Accordingly, I do not express such an opinion.

Based on my review, I am not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting , as described in Note A.

My review was made for the purpose of expressing limited assurance that there are no material modifications that should be made to the financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with the cash basis of accounting, as described in Note A. The information in the accompanying Schedule of Expenses - Cash Basis is presented only for supplementary analysis purposes. Such information has been subjected to the inquiry and analytical procedures applied in the review of the basic financial statements. This information is presented on the cash basis of accounting, and I am not aware of any material modifications that should be made thereto.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1998

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Commandery is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

Once again I come with some bad news and some good news about the Alabama Supplement. The bad news is that I am disappointed in the lack of news from across the state. Although I have received some news from Birmingham Metro Bodies, Anniston Bodies and Ashmole York Rite College in Montgomery, and an article from our Southeastern Department Commander, for the most part the only news I have run has been from events I have attended (such as the institution of Emrys W. John York Rite College in Birmingham). Although I sincerely appreciate what news is sent to me, I fervently believe that there is much more going on in our Commanderies that is well worth being shared with the rest of the state. For those with access to e-mail, I have posted my address with the Grand Lodge list of e-m@sons, in large part to give members an electronic address to send news to. Still, regular mail will certainly never be returned either.

There are several items of good news. As I promised to try to do last year, I did publish a tentative schedule of events for our meeting this year. PERSONAL HISTORY

Sir Knight Joe David Lee was born February 14, 1935 in Birmingham, Alabama, the son of David Marion Lee (who was an active York Rite Mason of the Birmingham York Rite Bodies) and Lola Meadows Lee. He attended the Birmingham City Schools and graduated from Woodlawn High School in January, 1953. He attended the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, graduating in August 1956 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration.

He met the former Martha Anne Fussell of Mobile, Alabama while participating in a pledge swap at the University. They were married on March 30, 1957 at the Springhill Baptist Church in Mobile.
