ADDRESS OF THE MOST ILLUSTRIOUS GRAND MASTER MacARTHUR DAVIS, GRAND MASTER 2003 - 2004

To the Officers, Companions, and Guests of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama:

It is indeed my pleasure to welcome each of you to this Grand Assembly. Opening on the second day of this meeting was an event hoped for by Your Illustrious Grand Master. I was not sure what to expect but at this point, may all our hard labor be completed and now the Council will be a very pleasurable conclusion to a successful meeting. To our Delegates, Thank you, for being here. The taking of your time to conduct the business of this Grand Chapter, Council and Commandery is vital to the operation of Your York Rite. As I have said many times across this Great State, YOU are the York Rite. If it were not for you, then there would be no York Rite in your hometown and therefore no Grand York Rite business to conduct. It is not WE, the Grand Officers, or Past Grand Officers, that are important, it is YOU. Then I request that you continue to do what you have been doing and do not grow weary of doing good. And to our Out-Of-State Guests, I regret that you had to be exposed to issues that were unpleasant to most of us but as I write this in advance, I feel that the Grand York Rite of Alabama did and will continue to do right by our neighbors as we hopefully have done in the past. You are welcome here and always will be. Thank You for coming.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

Another York Rite year has come and gone and we as York Rite Masons have done very little if anything to secure our future. Again we end a year with less than we began with. Most of our subordinate bodies have little or no enthusiasm for our future. Yet, there are some that work diligently for our growth and for our charities. These are to be commended. As I prepared this report, there were many things that I felt needed to be said. One of which brings to mind the word "Joy". In the Book of Psalms, 51:12 King David speaks to God, saying "return unto me the joy of my salvation". It did not say that salvation was lost but the joy of it had been lost. I fear that we have many Masons in Alabama, who has lost the "Joy" of their Masonic membership. I will go so far as to say that many of our members never discovered the joy of their membership in the beginning. This, indeed, seems to have invaded the York Rite in many of our subordinate Councils as well as the Chapters and Commanderies. Now that membership in the York Rite or Scottish Rite is not a requirement for membership in the Shrine. The fire, which may never have RAGED in the York Rite, has now burned to embers and ashes. The only benefit to our membership now is the Joy of the Knowledge; the work and the "Christian Brotherhood" that should prevail through out our state.

Companions and Sir Knights, we must stir the coals and wind the sparks before they go completely out in many of our bodies. Our membership is dangerously low. There are some bodies in Alabama that are near folding. We must find a way to promote our fraternity and work to prevent the loss of complete bodies. A positive attitude, a friendly smile and a caring spirit will be a place to start.

As a Grand Council Officer, I have experienced the highs and the lows of our fraternity as I traveled the State. I see those that are working and those that are not. I have spoken to those who for years have worked in the quarries and now are losing the battle to keep up the pace and have no one to fill their shoes. If you have a problem with this, try to find someone to accept a Secretary/Recorder position. To change this downward trend, we must take steps that we have never walked before. One of which is our finances. As I have said for years, I feel that finances or the lack of it, will close more Lodges in Alabama than loss of membership. The same applies to the York Rite. I'm not speaking of the Grand Bodies financial health either but rather the individual bodies. We have Chapters - Councils and Commanderies in the State that are struggling to keep their doors open. The Grand York Rite Bodies Financial Committee meetings are the very lowest point in my travels through the Grand York Rite. We, as the Grand Bodies, do absolutely nothing as a way to promote or otherwise assist the subordinate bodies. The committee meeting exist on need of more money and preventing one cent of existing money from being spent. I agree that the needs of the Grand Secretary/Recorder does make up most of the finance report, but the incoming head of the body should have an opportunity to implement a program that he feels is either needed or beneficial to the York Rite in general. But not one penny has been spent by any of the Grand Bodies to promote the York Rite in our State. Not one program has been promoted and paid for by the Grand York Rite that would promote or enhance the membership of our Order in the past fifteen years that I am aware of. The head of the Grand Chapter, Council or Commandery or the three together, should be able to promote a program that would benefit our fraternity. Example: A brochure or billboard that could be given or seen by Master Masons in this State.

Companions, a little of anything beats a lot of nothing. Can we say that what we are doing is working to our benefit to promote York Rite? As it is now, unless the second in line is appointed to the finance committee of his body, then he inherits a budget that he has no input in whatsoever. This should be changed. I agree that money should not be thrown away or wasted, but if we are ever going to attempt to save our fraternity, we must start now. We can save every dime we have now and when the last four thousand of us are gone, then the Grand Encampment will take what is theirs and the rest will go to the State as unclaimed funds. Or, we can use some of it each year to promote our cause. If it works, then our income will increase, if it does not, we can always say we tried. What I do know is that we can not continue to ask for per capita tax increases. This in itself causes loss of membership and defeats the purpose of the increase. I don't want to be one of those who made no effort to do anything. The heads of the Bodies raised funds this year to support this meeting. This may be the answer to some of our Grand meeting expense, but let's not cut out our reasons to gather each year and encourage our subordinate bodies and welcome our quest.

NECROLOGY

Again this year, we have lost many Companions to the Grim Reaper. May we always keep the families of those deceased Companions on our prayer list. The Grand Chaplain will make a more complete report later in this program and we will observe a moment of silent prayer for those families.

IN STATE TRAVEL

The Lord has blessed me this year in my travels, as I have traveled many miles in safety. Another blessing to me has been our Grand Sentinel, Companion James E. Qualls, who has made almost every trip that I did. I have said that he very well may be the most traveled Grand Sentinel that we have ever had. James, I appreciate the many miles of driving, the company and miles on your vehicle. As you can see, I went to every Council in Alabama. Two lacked one member present to have enough to open for business. Another was a complete "no show", a subject that I'm sure you have already heard enough about. The exception to this is DeKalb-Jackson Council #90. Your Grand Recorder has had no reports, no monies remitted and no reply to correspondence during the entire year. It was noted in the Grand Commander's Address that when the three Presiding Officers attempted to make an Official Visit, after notifying the entire membership by letter making them aware of the impending visit, there was no one who showed up at the Lodge Hall. It appears that the Presiding Officers may welcome some opinions from the General Membership at this Assembly as due to the consistent decline in our membership they are reluctant, and rightly so, to arrest the Charters since at the last received report showed a membership of 197 members which represents 7% of the membership in the state.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2003

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and were depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight-line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Council is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32.

NOTE 3 - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS:

Temporarily restricted net assets are reserved to cover expenses for specified officers to attend the Triennial Meeting. During the year there were no increases or decreases in this reserve account and the balance remained at \$2,025.00.

This Grand Council was concluded with prayer to reconvene at eleven A.M., Tuesday for open installation of the Grand Officers.


INSTALLATION OF GRAND COUNCIL OFFICERS FOR 2004 - 2005
