DECISIONS/OTHER ACTIONS

In June I was asked by a Companion of Montgomery Chapter No. 22 to rule upon the matter of a demit being withheld from one of its members. Upon investigation, I found the demit to be in order, and it was issued as I directed. I attended the Chapter's regular meeting on September 6th.

In August a petition was received from several Companions of Montgomery's Chapter No. 22 for impeachment of the presiding High Priest, citing several instances of offense. An appointed committee under my authority investigated these charges, and I made the decision that the High Priest had committed no offenses to constitute impeachment. I attended Montgomery's Chapter at their regular meeting on January 3, 1991.

In January of this year, I discussed with the Secretaries of Valley Chapter No. 132 and Lineville Chapter No. 150 the fact of not meeting the requirements of attendance for their respective Chapters as well as NO representation at our Annual Grand Convocation for the last five years. I gave permission to retain their charters until this meeting (February 25, 1991) in hope that a solution can be found to prevent their loss.

AUDIT

In November, 1990, I authorized our Grand Secretary, Right Excellent Companion Thomas W. Mann, to secure the services of Brother Raymond E. Potter, C.P.A., and his Firm of Potter, Bryant, and Tate, Certified Public Accountants, to audit the books of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Alabama.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

We have audited the accompanying statement of assets, liabilities and fund balance-cash basis of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Alabama (a non-profit organization) as of December 31, 1990, and the related statements of revenue and expenses - cash basis and changes in fund balance - cash basis for the year then ended. Those financial statements are the responsibility of the Chapter's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

As described in Note 1, the Chapter prepares its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements except that the statements include an inventory of supplies held for resale as well as a provision for depreciation of fixed assets. This basis is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the assets, liabilities, and fund balance of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Alabama as of December 31, 1990, and its revenue and expenses and the changes in its fund balance for the year then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation is computed on the straight line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Chapter is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.





In 1941 he went to work with the Seaboard Air Line R.R. as a locomotive fireman, and retired after thirty-five years of service from the Seaboard Family Lines System as a locomotive fireman and engineer.

He is married to the former Agnes Coogler. They have one son, Teddy, Jr., and three daughters: Vagirnia Fayrene, Judith Ann, and Betty Lou. The Grogans have nine grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Companion Grogan is an active member of First United Methodist Church of Piedmont, having served on the Administrative Board and as Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Lay Delegate to the Annual Conference, and a member of the Choir.

MASONIC HISTORY

Teddy R. Grogan, Sr., was initiated in Lozahatchee Lodge No. 97 F. & A.M., December 2, 1948, passed to the degree of Fellowcraft, December 16th, and raised to the Sublime degree of Master Mason, December 23, 1948. He served Lozahatchee Lodge as Worshipful Master, 1959-1960, and served as District Lecturer for District 10 for eleven years, being removed in 1991.

Companion Grogan has been an active York Rite Mason since 1954, and a member of Zamora Shrine Temple since 1955. He has served as principal officer of all Piedmont York Rite Bodies. He is a Member of Alabama Priory No. 31, K.Y.C.H.; Benjamine Franklin Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine; Monte Sano York Rite College No. 64; Vulcan Council No. 22, Knight Masons, U.S.A.; Council of Anointed High Priests; Order of the Silver Trowel; Knight Crusaders of the Cross; and a member of the Scottish Rite, Valley of Birmingham. He also is a member of the Lozahatchee Chapter No. 99, Order of the Eastern Star, and has served as Worthy Patron of this Chapter.

Companion Grogan served as Most Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama in 1986-1987.

- a May, 1823: A small group met in Mobile, for the purpose of forming the Grand Royal Arch Chapter in Alabama, and Grand Officers were appointed.
- b January, 1824: Regular annual convocation, and at the same time henceforward until otherwise noted.
- c June: There being no convocation in January, the Grand Chapter being declared irregular by the General Grand Chapter, it was therefore re-organized in June, 1827, and a new constitution adopted.
- d December: At this time annual convocations were changed to July.
- e July: In accordance with previous order, and at same time henceforward until otherwise noted.
- f No election, the Grand Chapter having "adjourned" on the evening of July 14th, until the next evening; but it did not convene again, the members having dispersed.
- g There had been no convocation of the Grand Chapter for upwards of seven years, in consequence, perhaps, of the Morgan excitement. In December, 1837, a few companions assembled in Tuscaloosa and re-organized by the adoption of a constitution and the election of Grand Officers. The constitution of 1837 was adopted, and the annual convocations fixed for December.
- h In 1925 the office of Deputy Grand High Priest was abolished.
- i At the Annual Convocation in December, 1944, the time of meeting was changed to the Third Monday in November.
- j At the Annual Convocation in 1946, on account of ill health, Companion John Wilson Terry was made Grand Treasurer Emeritus, and Companion Frank Albert Gillette was elected Grand Treasurer.
- k On August 4, 1947, following the death of Companion Guy T. Smith, Companion W.E. Glazner was appointed Acting Grand Secretary.
- l At the Annual Convocation, November, 1947, Companion Chas. H. Stubbinger was elected Grand Secretary.
- m At the Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of Alabama held on February 14, 1956, Companion Charles H. Stubbinger was elected M. E. Grand High Priest, to serve in this capacity during the election of officers.
- n On June 27, 1960, following sudden death of Companion Charles H. Stubbinger, Companion Thomas L. Cochran was appointed acting Grand Secretary.
- o On September 16, 1960, following resignation of Companion Thomas L. Cochran, Companion Gordon L. Evatt was appointed Grand Secretary.
- p On December 1, 1960, Companion Varna A. Rushton was appointed Grand Secretary to succeed Companion Gordon L. Evatt, resigned.
- q Grand York Rite office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Secretary.
- r At Annual Convocation, February, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Secretary. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Secretary Emeritus.
- s Annual Convocation date changed to last Monday in February.
- t As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite Unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.
- u On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 3621 South 5th Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35222.
- v On October 1, 1979, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 5504½ North 1st Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35212.
- w On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon, resigned.
- x At Annual Convocation, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.
