The One Hundred and Sixty-Ninth Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Alabama was held in the Ballroom of the Holiday Inn, Homewood, Birmingham, Alabama February 27, 1996, A. I. 2526.

Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Companion James E. Stutts declared the One Hundred Sixty-Ninth Annual Convocation open after ascertaining that all present were Royal Arch Masons, and that a constitutional number of Subordinate Chapters were represented. The following Grand Chapter Officers were present and in their stations:

The Invocation was given by Companion Ned Cox, Grand Chaplain followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

INTRODUCTION OF PAST GRAND HIGH PRIESTS

ADDRESS OF MOST EXCELLENT GRAND HIGH PRIEST JAMES E. STUTTS 1995-1996

To the Officers, Past Grand High Priests, Companions, and Distinguished Guests of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Alabama:

As we gather here today for the One Hundred Sixty-Ninth Annual Convocation of the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Alabama, it is indeed a pleasure, and a privilege, to welcome each of you on this special occasion. It hardly seems a year has passed since we last met and it is good to see the faces of old friends and the opportunity to make new friends, as we undertake the business of this Convocation. To each of you, if there is anything that you may need, or anything we may do to make your attendance here more comfortable, or enjoyable, all you have to do is ask.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

I am sorry to report that the "State of the Craft" is not what I had hoped it would be when my year as your Grand High Priest ended. Maybe it was the fault of your Grand High Priest and then too, maybe the membership in general. We continue to have a loss in membership. Of course there are losses by death, transfers, demits, but the one that bothers me most is the loss for non-payment of dues. These losses are not being off-set by new members, which I think is the responsibility of each of us. If we do not get the newly raised young Master Masons, I am afraid we are fighting a losing battle. We need these younger Masons and especially the young men coming into masonry through the Order of DeMolay.

I have read that as life does not flow on an even keel, the duties of a Grand High Priest have sad responsibilities. We lost three Chapters by consolidation and one by forfeiture of its charter. The members of these Chapters were transferred as shown below. Consolidation of Chapters is not the answer to membership problems.

After necessary approval of Chapters involved, and under provisions of Article III, Section 13, By-Laws of the M. E. Grand Chapter of Alabama, I approved consolidation of the following Chapters:

- 1. Central No. 64, Montevallo, with Birmingham Metro No. 76
- 2. East Lake No. 154, Birmingham, with Birmingham Metro No. 76
- 3. Valley No. 132, Lanett, with Montgomery No. 22

Under provisions of Article III, Section 2, By-Laws of the M. E. Grand Chapter of Alabama, I arrested the Charter of:

1. Lineville Chapter No. 150, Lineville

and asked that members be transferred to Anniston Chapter No. 105.

Anytime Chapters are consolidated, charters are forfeited, and members are transferred, it is not good for membership because if members do not attend their home Chapters, it is doubtful they will

travel "X-Number" of miles to attend another Chapter after being transferred.

As I write this report, Our Supreme Grand Master has allowed our Grand Chapter Line to remain together, of which I am thankful to our Heavenly Father. I do want to say I was sorry to have learned of the serious illness of our Junior Past Grand Commander, Knight Robert L. All of the above Officers, with the exception of the Right Excellent Grand Chaplain, Right Excellent Grand Marshal, Excellent Grand Master of the Third Veil, Excellent Grand Master of the Second Veil, Excellent Grand Master of the First Veil and the Excellent Grand Sentinel, shall be chosen by ballot, without nomination at each Annual Convocation, and the Officers elected shall be duly installed as soon after that as practicable. The Grand Chaplain, Grand Marshal, Grand Master of the Third Veil, Grand Master of the Second Veil, Grand Master of the First Veil, and the Grand Sentinel shall be appointed by the incoming Grand High Priest, and shall be installed along with the elected

Officers. All elected or appointed Officers shall hold their respective offices until their successors are duly elected and installed.

The Companions now elected to an office in the line of progression shall be advanced until they have been advanced to the office of Most Excellent Grand High Priest.

I never dreamed when I became a York Rite Mason Thirty years ago, I would some day serve this M. E. Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons as your M. E. Grand High Priest. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1995

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. <u>Inventories</u>

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation was computed on the straight line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Chapter is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

I believe that if these dear departed Companions could send a message back to we who remain, it would say something like this: Wish you here. Hurry home!



This Grand Chapter was concluded with prayer to reconvene at eleven A.M. on Tuesday February 27, 1996, for open installation of the Grand Officers.


INSTALLATION OF GRAND CHAPTER OFFICERS FOR 1996 - 1997

He is married to the former Bobbie Ruth Nicholson and has four daughters: Sharron Yvette Keel, Cheryl Denise Dorsey, Julia Nanette Young and Malissa Diane Ferguson, all of whom pursued careers in the field of education. He has five grandchildren. He opted to take early retirement on June 1, 1993 from Southern Company Services, Inc. in Birmingham. The last position he held was as a first line supervisor in the Mechanical Engineering Department. He is presently serving as the General Secretary for the Scottish Rite Bodies in the Valley of Huntsville. He has been an active member of the Cullman AFS Chapter working with foreign exchange students and teachers since 1986 and is presently serving a third term as President.

ORGANIZATION IN 1823 TO THE PRESENT TIME, WITH THE YEAR OF THEIR ELECTION OR APPOINTMENT. REVISED AND CORRECTED LIST OF GRAND OFFICERS OF THE GRAND CHAPTER OF ALABAMA SINCE ITS

A small group met in Mobile, for the purpose of forming the Grand Royal Arch Chapter in Alabama, and Grand Officers were appointed. b.....January, 1824: Regular annual convocation, and at the same time henceforward until otherwise noted.

There being no convocation in January, the Grand Chapter being declared irregular by the General Grand Chapter, it was therefore re-December: At this time annual convocations were changed to July. organized in June, 1827, and a new constitution adopted. d...

e....July: In accordance with previous order, and at same time henceforward until otherwise noted.

... b

No election, the Grand Chapter having "adjourned" on the evening of July 14th, until the next evening; but it did not convene again, the members There had been no convocation of the Grand Chapter for upwards of seven years, in consequence, perhaps, of the Morgan excitement.

In December, 1837, a few companions assembled in Tuscaloosa and re-organized by the adoption of a constitution and the election of Grand Officers. The constitution of 1837 was adopted, and the annual convocations fixed for December. In 1925 the office of Deputy Grand High Priest was abolished.

i.....At the Annual Convocation in December, 1944, the time of meeting was changed to the Third Monday in November. Gillette was elected Grand Treasurer.

.On August 4, 1947, following the death of Companion Guy t. Smith, Companion W. E. Glazner was appointed Acting Grand Secretary. 1.....At the Annual Convocation, November, 1947, Companion Chas. H. Stubinger was elected Grand Secretary.

m.....At the Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of Alabama held on February 14, 1956, Companion Charles H. Stubinger was elected M.E. Grand High Priest, to serve in this capacity during the election of officers.

n.....On June 27, 1960, following sudden death of Companion Charles H. Stubinger, Companion Thomas L. Cochran was appointed Acting Grand Secretary. On September 16, 1960 following resignation of Companion Thomas L. Cochran, Companion Gordon L. Evatt was appointed Grand Secretary

P.....On December 1, 1960, Companion Varna A. Rushton was appointed Grand Secretary to succeed Companion Gordon L. Evatt, who had resigned. q.....Grand York Rite office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Secretary.

Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Secretary Emeritus. r.....At Annual Convocation, February, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Secretary. s.....Annual Convocation date changed to last Monday in February.

t..... As proof of continued effort of Alabama to promote York Rite Unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery was held in February 1974.

October 1, 1979, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 5504 1/2 North 1st Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35212. On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 3621 South 5th Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35222 n...

W....On May 16, 1960, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon who resigned. x.....At Annual Convocation, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.

Y.....On September 1, 1991, Companion Thomas W. Mann and Companion James A. Kile resigned and Companion Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. appointed as Grand Treasurer and Companion Arthur C. Harding appointed as Grand Secretary.

Companion James A. Kile was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus. Companion Fred W. McCluskey, Jr. was elected Grand Treasurer and Companion Arthur At the Annual Convocation in February, 1992 Companion Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Secretary Emeritus and Past Grand High Priest (Honorary). C. Harding was elected Grand Secretary.
