DECEMBER 31, 1990

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. Inventories

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the firstin, first-out method, or market.

C. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation is computed on the straight line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Commandery is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.

I apologize for not being with you, but I have some personal business that prevents my being out of town right now. This year has not been bad, as far as news goes, but it could have been better. I've been able to fill about 68% of the columns with actual news. Only four areas (out of eighteen) have reported news: Huntsville with seven submissions, Mobile with five, Florence with two, and Gadsden with one. I'm sure other Commanderies had newsworthy events over the last year, and it is unfortunate that they could not have reported it. I know that we have active programs in more that just these four areas of the state. I anticipate a better year next year, but I need some more support. Remember, the Supplement is always the most widely read portion of the Knight Templar Magazine, and it is an excellent method of reaching your members who are not able, for one reason or another, to attend your Commandery meetings.



REMARKS OF SIR KNIGHT MARVIN E. FOWLER MOST EMINENT GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT

The Grand Commandery of Alabama was honored to have among its Distinguished Guests Sir Knight Marvin E. Fowler, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A. Sir Knight Fowler brought to the Conclave words of wisdom on several subjects. He spoke about the "Holy Land Pilgrimages", sponsored by the Grand Encampment. He told how

appreciative and inspired the ministers have been by these trips.

Sir Knight Fowler spoke about the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, and the many cases they have had — much more SPENT than RECEIVED by the Foundation, which has a \$32 million Endowment Fund. The Trustees passed a Resolution that cases have to be U.S. citizens. There is a limit also to the amount of property, income, and insurance that a patient can have and still receive free surgery from the Eye Foundation. He asked that Alabama continue their generous support.

Sir Knight Fowler talked about the Educational Loan Foundation. Some students are behind in their repayments. He said to make sure the CO-SIGNER will repay the student loan if the student DOES NOT. Have a Collector's AGENT try to collect unpaid loans or an attorney, who will add their charges to the

student's debt.

Our Most Eminent Grand Master thanked all for the many courtesies extended to his Lady Roberta and to him, and wished Alabama well in their future endeavors.

Remarks were made by other Distinguished Guests for the good of the Order.

LETTER OF DEPUTY GRAND COMMANDER



First Annual Conclave was held in Montgomery, Alabama, on Friday, November 30, 1860.

Grand Commandery Office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder in 1962.

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1963, Earl D. Holmes was elected and installed as Grand Commander, but he died before he could serve.

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus, and the As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Annual Conclave date changed from April each year, to last Monday in February to correspond with Grand Chapter and Grand Council.

On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 3621 South Fifth Avenue, Birmingham. Commandery was held in February, 1974.

September, 1979, Grand York Rite Office moved to 5504½ North First Avenue, Birmingham, 35212.

On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon, resigned.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.

CHRONOLOGY

Titles of Meetings and Dates of Bodies Composed Exclusively of Masons.

The ordinary Calendar, or vulgar era, is not generally used by Freemasons in dating their official documents. They have one peculiar to themselves, differing according to their various Rites.

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS in all parts of the World, add 4,000 years to the Christian era, calling it Anno Lucis—Year of Light; abbreviated A.L. (This fact has a symbolic reference, not because they believe Freemasonry is, but that the principles and light of the institution are coeval with the creation.) (See below.) F&AM Lodges hold "Communications."

ROYAL ARCH MASONS date from the building of the second Temple—530 B.C. Their style is, therefore, Anno Inventionis—A. Inv.—in the year of the discovery. Royal Arch Chapters hold "Convocations."

ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS date from the completion of Solomon's Temple 1000 B.C. Their style is Anno Depositionis—A. Dep.—in the year of Deposit. Royal and Select Councils hold "Assemblies."

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR date from the organization of the Order in 1118 A.D. Their style is, therefore, Anno Ordinia—A.E.—in the year of the Order. Knights Templar Commanderies hold "Conclaves."

ORDER OF THE HIGH PRIESTHOOD dates from the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchezadak, which occurred 1914 B.C. Their style is Anno Benedistionis—A.B.—in year of the Blessing. Councils of Annointed High Priest hold "Convocations."

ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE MASONS use the Jewish Calendar, which adds 3760 to the Christian era, styled Anno Mundi—A.M.—year of the World. Or, they sometimes use the Hebrew year which begins on the seventeenth of September, or feast of Tisri, using the initials A.H.—Anno Hebraico.

TEMPLES, A.A.O.N. MYSTIC SHRINE: Each thirty years from the Hejira, or July 15th, A.D. 602 constitutes a cycle. Nineteen of these years contain 355 days, Eleven, 356.

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS — Add 4,000 years.

Thus: 1991 + 4,000 = A. L. 5991

ROYAL ARCH MASONS — Add 530 years.

Thus: 1991 + 530 = A. Inv. 2521

ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS — Add 1,000 years.

Thus, 1991 + 1,000 = A. Dept. 2991

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR — Subtract 1,118 years.

Thus, 1991 - 1,118 = A.O. 873

ORDER OF HIGH PRIESTHOOD — Add 1,913 years.

Thus, 1991 + 1,913 = A.B. 3,904

SCOTTISH RITE MASONS — Add 3,760 years.

Thus: 1991 + 3,760 = A. M. 5751
