PROCEEDINGS OF THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SECOND ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE GRAND COUNCIL OF ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS OF ALABAMA

WELCOME ADDRESS BY THE HONORABLE MELVIN BAILEY, SHERIFF OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, ALABAMA

The Honorable Melvin Bailey, of Jefferson County, Alabama, (soon to be Illustrious Potentate of Zamora Shrine Temple) commented:

'It is unusual for a sheriff to welcome visitors. We usually are running people OUT of town. I was born here, educated here, and have been Sheriff for twenty-eight years, so that gives me the right to welcome you. You are a wonderful group,

and we are pleased to have you all in Birmingham and Alabama.

As you saw in the paper this morning, there have been some bad things happening here as there have been elsewhere, with drugs and gangs. There have been good things happening also. There are about a thousand churches in this county. I credit them and the Masonic family with helping to keep our district on an even keel. Masonic members are the *mettle* of a community, and the Shrine is an extension of Freemasonry. We have this obligation that we maintain order, and that we stand for the very fibre of the Constitution of the United States of America. We have our work cut-out for us to keep us from being like Russia. We rejoice at the changes taking place in Russia, but we must keep our eyes open. There could be so many brush fires that we won't have the strength to keep them down if we are not very careful and alert.

Again, welcome to Alabama, Birmingham, and Jefferson County. We are glad to have you here. I never feel more safe than when I am with this kind of Body." A very warm response to his remarks was given by all.

NOTES TO FÍNANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1989

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

A. Basis of Accounting

The organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting. Under this method certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not purport to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

B. <u>Inventories</u>

Inventories are carried at the lower of cost determined by the first-in, first-out method, or market.

C. Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are recorded at cost and depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Depreciation is computed on the straight line method for financial reporting purposes.

NOTE 2 - TAX STATUS:

The Council is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c), and from state income taxes under Alabama Code Section 40-18-32. An informational tax return is filed each year on IRS Form 990.



INSTALLATION OF GRAND COUNCIL OFFICERS FOR 1990-1991


