PROCEEDINGS OF THE ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL CONVOCATION OF THE

GRAND ROYAL ARCH CHAPTER OF ALABAMA

The One Hundred and Fifty-Eighth Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Alabama was held in the "Great Gatsby" Ballroom of the Ramada Inn-Airport, Birmingham, Alabama, on February 24, 25, 26, 1985, A.I.2515.

After ascertaining that all present were Royal Arch Masons, and that a constitutional number of Subordinate Chapters were represented, Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Companion Ray R. WELCOME ADDRESS BY THE HONORABLE MELVIN BAILEY, SHERIFF OF JEFFERSON COUNTY, ALABAMA

The Honorable Melvin Bailey, Sheriff of Jefferson County, Alabama, commented that Lodge workers run hand in hand with Church workers, and the problem it seems, is that although they are present and willing to do the work, somewhere in depth, there is missing a lack of conviction. There is a willingness to move as a body, but not as individuals. He observed that about ten percent of the members in a Lodge do about ninety percent of the work, and he commented that those members in attendance at this meeting today must be that ten percent.

Companion Bailey stressed that we have to "stand our ground" on the home front by our participation in these matters, as well as the military stands when ordered to a foreign shore. We have to be the fortress necessary to withstand our problems domestically.

He welcomed to Birmingham the out-of state and the intra-state visitors with the comment that "although we stand small, we are strong. And like the Marines, we are just looking for a few good men."

ADDRESS OF MOST EXCELLENT GRAND HIGH PRIEST RAY R. MORGAN, JR.

1984-1985

I welcome you, my Companions, to this 158th Annual Convocation of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Alabama.

There were a number of things we would like to have done, but, unfortunately some of these were not done.

I wanted to visit each Chapter in the state. Each was written a letter shortly after my installation. Some of the Chapters responded and some of them did not. I had some invitations which I had to decline due to a conflict. My list of in-state Visitations shows the Chapters I visited.

We always hope that we can eliminate suspensions for non payment of dues, and some times I don't believe we work hard enough on this. On January 1, 1976, we had 10,020 members. On January 1, 1985, we had 7,464 members. In eight years we lost 2,556 members. If this decline continues, in a few years we will not exist.

We must work harder to secure new members and to stop losing the ones we have. Deaths we can do nothing about, but the other things we can. The quality of our work must be improved, and we should not cheat the Candidates by communicating and/or omitting a large portion of the work. My Companions, I hope each one of you will take a hard look at our York Rite and go back home and "GO TO WORK".

In looking back over past proceedings, I note that M.E. Companion Fred W. Vaughan used a "PH" factor during his term. This being Peace and Harmony, and so far as I know, we have Peace and Harmony in our Jurisdiction.

Last year we had several Chapters delinquent with reports and dues. I have personally contacted each one of these Chapters and hope as you read this they are all current.

On July 23, 1984, I received a letter from Companion Walter H. Winchester, General Grand King, General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons, International. He asked me, in the event he was advanced to General Grand High Priest, to serve on the DeMolay Committee. I appreciate very much the recognition given our Grand Jurisdiction and with great pleasure I accepted.

I appreciate very much the Honor you gave me last year when you elected me your Grand High Priest. I have enjoyed serving you. My wife and I enjoyed the visits we made together. I would certainly be remiss if I did not express my appreciation and thanks to my wife, Peggy, for encouraging me and putting up with all the times I was gone to a meeting.

NECROLOGY

We are grateful and thank the Supreme Architect for sparing the lives of the members of the Grand Line this year. There were 162 of our Companions who passed from this shore to the other, and we extend to their families our heartfelt sympathies.

BOND

I received the bond on our Grand Treasurer and Grand Secretary and have it

ready to hand to my successor.

I received a request from the Huntsville York Rite bodies concerning a living memorial dedicated to the late Companion and Sir Knight, G. O. McKinney. After reading the material submitted and conferring with the Chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee, I advised them on December 6, 1984, that I could not see any conflict with our laws. They were advised, so far as the grand chapter is concerned, to pursue the project.

I received a letter from Piedmont Chapter No. 111 advising that they had been trying since May, 1984, to secure a transfer for a Companion from Talladega Chapter No. 23 to Piedmont. They have not received this transfer. On December 5, 1984, I wrote companion Glen Trammell, Secretary of Talladega Chapter, to advise

the status of this transfer.

AUDIT

On December 5, 1984, I authorized our Grand Secretary, Companion Thomas W. Mann, to secure the services of John E. Evans, C.P.A. to audit the books of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter.

REPORT ON NECROLOGY


To the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Alabama: Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions All:

This Resolution Received in The Grand Secretary's Office December 31,1984. To The Most Excellent Grand High Priest and members of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Alabama:

Companion Robert L. Byars, Jr., moved that the Grand York Rite Perpetual Life Membership be ammended and adopted as follows:

- To remove it from the hands of the Grand Bodies and move it into the hands of the local Bodies.
- 2. To dissolve the Board of Trustees of the Perpetual Life Membership Fund.
- 3. To include that all proceeds received by a York Rite Body to the Perpetual Life Membership Fund, as adopted by that Body, should they so desire to adopt it, would be retained into an interest bearing account, and that only the interest be used for operating funds, and the principal shall be retained.
- 4. If a Perpetual Life Member of a York Rite Body transfers from that York Rite Body within the State to another York Rite Body, the Secretary-Recorder of that York Rite Body, from which he is transferring, upon completion of transfer, shall remit the funds of the Perpetual Life Membership, less the interest, to the York Rite Body to which he is transferring, at which time those funds will be put on deposit, and only the interest may be used.

REMARKS OF DISTINGUISHED GUESTS

Companion Dr. Walter Winchester, General Grand High Priest of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, spoke:

"Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Most Worshipful Grand Master, other friends, and those people that I think are probably the most important people here - the delegates who were elected by their respective chapters, councils, and commanderies: I would like to ask those delegates to stand at this time. Let me salute

the real working people in the Grand Chapter of Alabama.

A few nights ago I looked up into the sky and looked at Halley's Comet. I don't know how many of you have looked at Halley's Comet on its present return flight to our area of the celestrial world, but in your mind's eye you can see it. It's been predicted it's on its way. It will be seen by the naked eye in a few months from now. In the same way we have known that comet is returning, let me remind you that Masonry is also on a course, and it's just as predictible, not dependent upon the forces of astronomical life and world, but dependent upon people like you and me. That's why I wanted to particularly recognize those delegates who have been elected by their respective chapters, councils, and commanderies. We are living in a space age and we need to continue to recognize that. Masonry is a system of moral instruction taught by symbols (comets, stars, and constellations may be some of our symbols) yet it takes hard work from day to day.

The General Grand Chapter provides you with many services. It is a confederation of more than 50 Grand Chapters around the world, united in the ideal of trying to help do some of those things which individual Grand Chapters can't do by themselves. With an opportunity to share information one with another, we have developed a system of rewards and recognitions which are observed across the Capitular world. You will be seeing more of that a little bit later today. They have had demonstrations in leadership training with the opportunity of sharing these techniques with your companions from all across the United States, from Canada, and other countries in our regional conferences. Although some of you may think these regional conferences are designed only for the Grand High Priest or the Grand King, let me assure you right now that it is for all Royal Arch Masons. Come! I think you will find it interesting and worthwhile. And while I mention that, let me recognize the man who will have the opportunity of chairing the Southeast Regional Conference right here in your own home state next August, a year from now - our regional Deputy, J. Benny Allen.

Among the things the General Grand Chapter has done in the past is to provide you with various promotional aids and literature. Companion Allen has them available for you at various meetings. Let me urge you to take advantage of them. We have identified ourselves with a great philanthropy in the Capitular world, The Royal Arch Research Assistance. We now have an endowment fund that is well over three quarters of a million dollars. The income of which, is used to help support basic research in the field of a very unique kind of learning disability-sensual auditory perceptual defects. I hope some of you have seen or will see the motion picture that has been produced which describes this, 'The Lonely World'. A beautiful film which can be shown in your chapters, councils, commanderies, lodges, to the ladies, or can be shown on television. It is a film which has won international awards for the maker of the film, Allen Roberts of Virginia.

One of the things the General Grand Chapter was noted for, a few years ago, was terrible problems with their finances. As a result, a Companion in the state of Michigan developed the idea for a beautiful York Rite chalice. The original was presented in York, England by Gordon Merrick a few years ago. It is excellent glass, and a collector's item. It is designed so that it can have whatever seal you would like on it. It is now available, so let me urge you to use this in your own chapters as a compliment to someone particularly revered within your own circles.

One of the functions of the General Grand Chapter is to help in the dissemination of Capitular masonry around the world, and I am pleased to report to you I have a dispensation for a charter chapter in Columbia, South America. This chapter will be in Bogata, and their charter will be presented within the next several months. York Rite Masonry is on the move.

In the field of education we've been neglectful in recent years, and for that reason, many Grand Chapters are losing members. The General Grand Chapter has a program during this triennium for a conference in masonic education to teach things other than leadership. Leadership training you receive in our regional meetings, but we want to share some of these other things: philosophy, history, archeology, etc.

The key word in the Royal Arch is the word 'excellence', so everything that you do, I do, and we do, as Royal Arch Masons, should be marked by the characteristic of 'excellence'. We should not settle for less. As we salute you, the leaders in York Rite of Alabama, let me say that the difference between mediocrity and excellence is YOU. You make the difference, nothing else. Let's go for excellence! It's

worthwhile.'

Most Excellent Companion Van A. Evans, Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Mississippi, commented that to have a viable, growing, and dynamic fraternal organization you must have two things: visibility and desirability. For success, you must have your masonic bodies visable, and you must make yourselves, as a membership, visible and desirable. If you, as a member, can make yourself visible and desirable, there is nothing more Masonry can ask of you.

Most Excellent Companion Bob F. Stephenson, Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Tennessee, expressed his appreciation for the courtesies that have been shown him and the rest of the Companions

from Tennessee.

Companion A. J. Tullos, Deputy Grand Master, International Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay, stated he was pleased to represent the Grand Master of the Supreme Council, Order of DeMolay, Companion Don W. Wright. He brought greetings from the Grand Master and more than three million active and senior

DeMolays throughout the world.

Companion Tullos further remarked that although you may have heard DeMolay was a failing organization, not to believe it. They are a growing organization. They have a mission to make better young men to serve their communities. From these better young men you will have the pool you can draw from to help save the Masonic Order. DeMolay can't do it alone. It can only furnish the young men to draw from. We try to set the example for these young men, to make them want to become one of us.

We are building a permanent building in Kansas City and we are going to be, as mentioned by Companion Van Evans, in a visible location. We will be seen by people driving or flying into Kansas City. We would like to extend the invitation to each of you to have the opportunity to help us make that the headquarters for a

youth organization of which we can all be proud.

Right Excellent Companion J. Benny Allen, Right Excellent District Deputy General Grand High Priest of the Southeast Region, announced that the 1986 Southeast Region York Rite Meeting would be held in August in Dothan, Ala-

bama, for all Grand Chapter officers.

Companion Allen further announced an International York Rite Class would be held in Atlanta, Georgia, October 31, and November 1, 1986. He stated the General Grand High Priest, the Most Puissant General Grand Master, and the Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment would be in attendance to help in the degree work. INSTALLATION OF GRAND CHAPTER OFFICERS FOR 1985-1986



- June; there being no convocation in January, the Grand Chapter being declared irregular by the General Grand Chapter, it was therefore re-organized in June, 1827, and a new constitution adopted. 0
 - December. At this time annuan convocations were changed to July. ם
- July; in accordance with previous order, and at same time henceforward until other wise noted.
- No election, the Grand Chapter having "adjourned" on the evening of July 14th, until the next evening: but it did not convene again, the members
- There had been no convocation of the Grand Chapter for upwards of seven years, in consequence, perhaps, of the Morgan excitement. In December, 1837, a few companions assembled in Tuscaloosa and re-organized by the adoption of a constitution and the election of Grand Officers. The constitution of 1837 was adopted, and the annual convocations fixed for December. having dispersed. 8
 - In 1925 the office of Deputy Grand High Priest was abolished.
- At the Annual Convocation in December, 1944, the time of meeting was changed to the Third Monday in November.
- At the Annual Convocation in 1946, on account of ill health, Companion John Wilson Terry was made Grand Treasurer Emeritus, and Companion Frank Albert Gillette was elected Grand Treasurer.
 - On August 4, 1947, following the death of Companion Guy T. Smith, Companion W. E. Glazner was appointed Acting Grand Secretary. At the Annual Convocation, November, 1947, Companion Chas. H. Stubbinger was elected Grand Secretary.
- At the Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of Alabama held on February 14, 1956, Companion Charles H. Stubinger, was elected E. Grand High Priest, to serve in this capacity during the election of officers. Z ш
 - On September 16, 1960, following resignation of Companion Thomas L. Cochran, Companion Gordon L. Evatt was appointed Grand Secretary. On June 27, 1960, following sudden death of Companion Charles H. Stubinger, Companion Thomas L. Cochran was appointed acting Grand Secretary. On December 1, 1960, Companion Varna A. Rushton was appointed Grand Secretary to succeed Companion Gordon L. Evatt, resigned.
 - Grand York Rite office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Secretary
- At Annual Convocation, February, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Secretary. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Secretary Emeritus. Annual Convocation date changed to last Monday in February.
- As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite Unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.
 - On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 3621 South 5th Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35222.
 - On October 1, 1979, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 55041/2 North 1st Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35212. On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon, resigned. 8
 - At Annual Convocation, February. 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.
