On February 15, 1985, we ranked 37th in the Seventeenth Voluntary Campaign with a total contribution of \$1,483.00. These figures certainly indicate that we are not carrying our fair share of the load.

We urge all Sir Knights to participate in our great humanitarian project, and help us correct the inequity between funds received from the Foundation and funds contributed to it in Alabama, by supporting our Voluntary Campaign.

As of the 11th week of the Campaign ending February 15, 1985, the Foundation office has received and posted a total of \$1,483.00 from this Grand Commandery. This total represents an average per capita contribution of \$.20, based on a total membership of 7,578 knights. As of this date, we rank number 37 of all jurisdictions.

Since this official report, your Committee has forwarded an additional \$130.00, and has received information that another \$140.00 has been forwarded directly to the Foundation. In addition, there has been delivered and in hand a check in the amount of \$2,500.00 from Cyrene Commandery No. 10 in Birmingham, a check in the amount of \$1,563.37 from Florence Commandery No. 39, and a cash amount of \$240.00 collected at the Divine Service this past Sunday. This is a total of \$4,573.37 which has not as yet been posted to the Foundation's records. This will bring our total as of this date to \$6,056.37, which will result in a per capita average in the amount of 79.7 cents per member.

Sir Knights, the 17th Voluntary Campaign is still far behind previous years for the same point in time. There is still adequate time to return to your respective commanderies, and renew your efforts to make this campaign one of the most successful ever. Remember the gift of sight is one of the greatest gifts that can be

given.


To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

ALABAMA GRAND YORK RITE HOLDING COMPANY

To the Grand Officers, Companions, and Sir Knights of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Alabama:

We, the undersigned members of the Alabama Grand York Rite Holding Com-

pany, report the following:

On Sunday, July 1, 1984, a special meeting with the Trustees of the Woodlawn Fraternal Lodge No. 525 F. & A.M. of Alabama was called to discuss the business of signing a lease for the offices and warehouse space occupied by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Alabama located at 5504 North 1st Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama. Under the terms of the new lease, the monthly rental was increased from \$300.00 per month to \$340.00 per month or from \$3,600.00 per annum as was stipulated in the original lease agreement dated October 1, 1979. The Holding Company was also advised at this meeting that the Woodlawn Fraternal Lodge No. 525 was in negotiation with HDH Enterprises of Birmingham, Alabama, to lease the entire building, and that if that transaction took place, the Grand York Rite Bodies would be under lease to them.

In a letter from HDH Enterprises dated August 22, 1984, to Thomas W. Mann, Grand Secretary-Recorder, the Grand York Rite Bodies were notified that as of September 1, 1984, HDH Enterprises would assume all leases, and as of that date

all monies for rentals would be payable to them.

Although the Holding Company continues to investigate properties to purchase for a permanent office for the Grand York Rite Bodies, to date, no suitable location has been found that fulfills the necessary requisites of space, location, cost, and terms.

RESOLUTION

This Resolution Received in the Grand Recorder's Office December 31, 1984. To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Alabama:

Sir Knight Robert L. Byars, Jr., moved that the Grand York Rite Perpetual Life Membership be ammended and adopted as follows:

1. To remove it from the hands of the Grand Bodies and move it into the hands of the local Bodies.

To dissolve the Board of Trustees of the Perpetual Life Membership Fund.
 To include that all proceeds received by a York Rite Body to the Perpetual Life Membership Fund, as adopted by that Body, should they so desire to adopt it, would be retained into an interest bearing account, and that only the interest be used for operating funds, and the principal shall be retained.

4. If a Perpetual Life Member of a York Rite Body transfers from that York Rite Body within the State to another York Rite Body, the Secretary-Recorder of that York Rite Body, from which he is transferring, upon completion of transfer, shall remit the funds of the Perpetual Life Membership, less the interest, to the York Rite Body to which he is transferring, at which time those funds will be put on deposit, and only the interest may be used.

After some discussion, the ammendment was seconded, and passed unanimously.

It was moved and passed that the Grand York Rite be directed to refund to Dothan York Rite Bodies the money remaining in the one Perpetual Life Membership account after two years of per capita tax has been deducted.

RESOLUTION

The Resolution concerning raffling was withdrawn due to the ruling by the Jurisprudence Committee that it was out of order.

ADDRESS OF SIR KNIGHT DONALD H. SMITH, RIGHT EMINENT DEPUTY GRAND MASTER OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT

Sir Knight Donald H. Smith, Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, voiced his appreciation for the hospitality shown him. He said, "I thought of the three 'H's' when I thought of the three York Rite bodies here together this weekend. Those are Harmony, Hospitality, and Heart. I speak to the heart because I want to tell you that two great Past Grand Commanders of this Grand Commandery serve the 'heart' of the Grand Encampment very closely. One of your senior Past Grand Commanders, Sir Knight George W. Sorrell, serves as a trustee on the Eye Foundation and has for many years. He is very much a part of it and very much a promoter of its good. I congratulate you for having such a man as this in your Grand Commandery and I thank you for sending him to be with the Grand Encampment.

The other part of the 'heart' here is another Past Grand Commander, Thomas W. Mann, who is Chairman of the Knights Templar Educational Foundation, and has been under two Grand Masters. I think this is a wonderful tribute not only to Tom but to your Grand Commandery as well. I thank you for his services also.

The 21st Century is just fifteen years away. Some of us in this room today may not be alive to see it, but we are moving toward it. What I want to do with this great Grand Encampment and this Grand Commandery is to think in these terms: I want to march into the 21st Century with my head up, going forward, knowing what is going to happen, not backing into it while we are crying about how many people we are losing.

The reason we are losing members is because we do not give them enough personal contact. I notice you, like all jurisdictions, are having trouble with

non-payment of dues. How many of your Grand Commanders, your Commanders, your Recorders, or members, are willing to take the time necessary to see these people on a personal basis. Find out why they became a Templar in the first place and why they aren't interested in staying one.

Let them know that 10% of all patients taken care of by the Eye Foundation in the entire country have come from Alabama. Aren't you proud of that. Many students now attending the universities have been given the opportunity of doing so through student loans given out by the K.T. Educational Foundation. These two things should be conveyed to those who haven't paid their dues. Personal

contact is a difficult thing to do. But It Works.

Another point I would like to make as we get into this 21st Century attitude. I would like you to think in terms of COMPUTERS. This is a computer age. One of the other problems we have with membership loss is the fact we don't have enough contact with our members. We lose their addresses and we don't furnish them with enough information. Every Grand Commandery should be thinking about having a computer. I mean a home type computer with a printer. This will enable you to keep the names and addresses current and you can print them out in the form of address labels. Send out a news letter. The thing is, if we keep the addresses current, every Knight Templar is reminded that he is a K.T., because he can be notified of the happenings in the Commandery and other bodies. He will know who the current Grand Commander is, who are the recipients of the Eye Foundation funds, along with any other pertinent information.

Remember every one of you has contributed to the Eye Foundation. A total of \$6,900.00 was paid this year by you through your dues assessment. We are all contributors. If we let others know what we are doing with these funds, they will possibly want to be contributors also. This gets into the realm of public relations. All of these things, computors, public relations, and information will help. Now all we lack is the answer to this question: 'Who is going to do it?'. When you look into the mirror each morning you know if it is going to work, it has to start with YOU.

Membership starts in the symbolic lodges, and it should not stop until you rise from the foot of that line knighted as Templars. 'Arise, Sir Knight'. What a word.

What a thought.

At this point I would like to mention a few more words in favor of computers. After all if we are going to look to the future we must modernize, and the future is in computers. We can store all the files and information about your chapters, councils and commanderies on computer disks. These can be stored in a bank vault or fireproof place. In the event our building is destroyed by fire, all of our records are not lost. There are so many good things that a computer can help with, it is a shame that we haven't had one a long time ago. Think about this. It isn't a 21st Century thing, this is a plain old 1985 thing to think about. It will help you maintain membership, because it keeps the records up to date with very little effort. This leaves more time for the personal contact I mentioned before.

Another reason we are losing membership is due to a shift of population. The York Rite was built in smaller communities where men could come to their lodge and receive all their degrees in one place. As a result of the population movement, in many cases there are not enough members to fill the stations. As a result, men drop out. This leaves buildings and equipment standing idle. Why not move this equipment to a town that wants an active commandery. Move with the population. Make use of your assets.

Remember for an active commandery YOU are the one who has to get involved."

Sir Knight Roberts was employed by the Birmingham Board of Education for fifteen months. He became employed by Birmingham Electric Company on August 21, 1930. Birmingham Electric Company merged with Alabama Power Company in 1952, where he worked until his retirement on September 1, 1976.

As a member of the Ruhama Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama, he served on the board of Deacons, as Chairman of the Nominating Committee, and has served on the Finance Committee. Presently he is serving as Chairman of the Benovolence Committee, as a member of the Nominating Committee, and on the active Board of Deacons.


MASONIC HISTORY

Sir Knight Roberts was first introduced to Masonry on December 7, 1950, when he was initiated an Entered Apprentice in Phillips Memorial Lodge No. 832 in Birmingham, Alabama. He was passed to the degree of Fellowcraft on January 18, 1951, and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on February 15, 1951. In 1955, he served as Worshipful Master of Phillips Memorial Lodge No. 832. Later, having moved to the eastern section of Birmingham, he transferred his membership and became affiliated with Woodlawn Fraternal Lodge No. 525 on March 2, 1961. He served as Worshipful Master of Woodlawn Fraternal Lodge No. 525 in 1970.

Sir Knight Roberts received the Chapter and Council degrees May 6, 1961, and the Orders of the Commandery May 13, 1961. He served as Excellent High Priest of Woodlawn Chapter No. 146, Illustrious Master of Woodlawn Council No. 71, and Eminent Commander of Woodlawn Commandery No. 31.

He is a member of the Order of Silver Trowel, Anointed High Priests, Knight Masons, Order of Eastern Star, and Zamora Temple.

First Annual Conclave was held in Montgomery, Alabama, on Friday, November 30, 1860.

Grand Commandery Office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder in 1962.

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus, and the Annual Conclave date changed from April, each year, to last Monday in February, to correspond with Grand Chapter and Grand Council As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.

On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 3621 South Fifth Avenue, Birmingham.

September, 1979, Grand York Rite Office moved to 5504½ North First Avenue, Birmingham, 35212.

On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon, resigned.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.

CHRONOLOGY

Titles of Meetings and Dates of Bodies Composed Exclusively of Masons.

The ordinary Calendar, or vulgar era, is not generally used by Freemasons in dating their official documents. They have one peculiar to themselves, differing according to their various Rites.

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS in all parts of the World, add 4,000 years to the Christian era, calling it Anno Lucis—Year of Light; abbreviated A.L. (This fact has a symbolic reference, not because they believe Freemasonry is, but that the principles and light of the institution are coeval with the creation.) (See below.) F&AM Lodges hold "Communications."

ROYAL ARCH MASONS date from the building of the second Temple—530 B.C. Their style is, therefore, Anno Inventionis—A. Inv.—in the year of the discovery. Royal Arch Chapters hold "Convocations."

ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS date from the completion of Solomon's Temple 1000 B.C. Their style is Anno Depositionis—A. Dep.—in the year of Deposit. Royal and Select Councils hold "Assemblies."

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR date from the organization of the Order in 1118 A.D. Their style is, therefore, Anno Ordinia—A.E.—in the year of the Order. Knights Templar Commanderies hold "Conclaves."

ORDER OF THE HIGH PRIESTHOOD dates from the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchezadak, which occurred 1914 B.C. Their style is Anno Benedistionis—A.B.—in year of the Blessing. Councils of Annointed High Priest hold "Convocations."

ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE MASONS use the Jewish Calendar, which adds 3760 to the Christian era, styled Anno Mundi—A.M.—year of the World. Or, they sometimes use the Hebrew year which begins on the seventeenth of September, or feast of Tisri, using the initials A.H.—Anno Hebraico.

TEMPLES, A.A.O.N. MYSTIC SHRINE: Each thirty years from the Hejira, or July 15th, A.D. 602 constitutes a cycle. Nineteen of these years contain 355 days, Eleven, 356.

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS — Add 4,000 years.

Thus: 1985 + 4,000 = A.L. 5985

ROYAL ARCH MASONS — Add 530 years.

Thus: 1985 + 530 = A. Inv. 2515

ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS — Add 1,000 years.

Thus: 1985 + 1,000 = A. Dept. 2985

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR — Subtract 1,118 years.

Thus: 1985 - 1,118 = A. O. 867

ORDER OF HIGH PRIESTHOOD — Add 1,913 years.

Thus: 1985 + 1,913 = A. B. 3898

SCOTTISH RITE MASONS — Add 3,760 years.

Thus: 1985 + 3,760 = A. M. 5745
