I have examined the statements of assets, liabilities and fund balance of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama, Birmingham, Alabama, as of December 31, 1985 and 1984, and the related statements of revenue, expenses and changes in fund balance for the years then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1, the organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements; consequently, certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly the assets, liabilities and fund balance arising from cash transactions of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama, Birmingham, Alabama, as of December 31, 1985 and 1984, and the revenue collected and the expenses paid during the years then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1, which basis has been applied in a manner consistent with that of the preceding year.

My examinations were made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The information included on Schedules 1 and 2, although not considered necessary for a fair presentation of the assets, liabilities and fund balance arising from cash transactions and revenue collected and expenses paid, is presented by the organization as a supplement to the financial statements taken as whole.

REPORT OF PATRIOTIC COMMITTEE

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Alabama:

Today the topic of my report is, "What Makes America Great." First, I would like to mention a few simple symbols which I will refer to later: A piece of paper, a building, and a book.

In my travels during the last fifty years by plane, by ship, by train, and by automobile, and in my business, military, and Templar activities, I discovered that a part of the greatness of America can be found in the **factories** and **farms** that have made the American economy the **strongest** in the world, and have given her a standard of living unequaled by that of any other nation. The hum of machinery sounds throughout the day, and the glow from thousands of furnaces lights the night, in order to supply the demand for goods.

Within America's boundaries, there are wide prairies with fields of grain, pastures dotted with well-fed cattle, irrigated valleys, and orchards standing on terraced hillsides. Where tractors turn up rich fertile soil, or dams loose their water on arid deserts, huge crops spring up. At harvest time, bales of cotton stand on loading platforms, granaries are filled to capacity, and everywhere farmers ship their produce to city markets. But, many nations have large industries and

bountiful harvests, so it is not this alone that makes America great.

America offers her citizens the benefits of a free education. The public school system teaches each generation the importance of good government, thus enabling them to take their place in the responsible positions of society. They are made to understand the value of a human being and the strength of high ideals. But, all great civilizations have had some form of educational facilities; therefore, this alone does not make America great.

America is an amalgamation of people from all regions of the globe: the adventurous people who forged a nation from a wilderness, the courageous people who sometimes died for freedom yet counted it worth the cost of their lives, and the working people who never gave up until they reached their goal. These laid the foundation for this democracy. America is a land of many races and creeds but only one nationality - Americans. Here then is a glimpse of the true greatness of America, for the people are the government. Moreover, this government is as strong as the people make it, and as corrupt as they let it become. What plan of kings or tyrants would have made this nation what it is, or given to any people the opportunities which our federal government has given to us? In what other country could a man follow the dictates of his conscience or his religious beliefs without fear of persecution?

In 1976 we celebrated our 200th birthday, and yes, the symbols I referred to in my opening remarks, like our own Masonic symbols, did much to make America

Great.

A piece of paper: the Declaration of Independence, and another piece of paper: our Constitution with its Bill of Rights, did, and still hold good these 200 years. What other Country can boast of such documents that are as effective today as they have been this long, long time since our founding?

A building: yes, the Church, where each one of us can choose and worship in our own faith and beliefs without restraint or bias.

And, of course, our Capitol Building, both State and National, where each one of us can vote freely for our chosen representatives, and voice our opinions, our thoughts, and our desires freely without interference.

We also have some other symbols: A Song, our Church hymns and our National Anthem. These songs have taken us through Civil War, local uprisings, depressions, etc., and still leave us the leading nation in the World.

Yet another symbol: the Flag, the Stars and Stripes, symbolizing by its stripes the original 13 States, and the Stars denoting 50 United States all banded and bonded together to continue to keep America great.

And the final symbol: a Book, yes, The Holy Bible, on which all of us have sworn,

whether in Masonry or in Governmental Service, to be good and true to our faith and beliefs.

All these symbols together reflect reverence, dignity, and strength.

Yes, I will admit we have a small minority, small, yes, but loud spoken, at times raucous, always self opinionated, never factual, and always self-seeking. I am sorry to say this, but their loud clamor has been helped by the so-called media, Press, Radio, and Television, as well as political mongers who exploit and publicize their efforts, and endeavor to soft pedal the not so explosive and silent Majority.

And we do have that large and vast majority who, when aroused, quietly and effectively continue to exemplify the meaning of the Symbols of our Country and Our Craft.

Where else in this World is there one Country that can Claim:

Freedom of Speech Freedom from Fear Freedom from Want Freedom of Worship

Our founding fathers were wise in that they functioned in a simple, basic, and factual manner, rather than being complex, irrelevant, and opinionated.

Keep America Strong and America will Always be Great!

You may work in America's factories, sail her rivers, till her lands, attend her schools, and live among her citizens; yet, not until you observe these people in the church of their choice, proclaiming their beliefs, will you understand the greatness of America. When you see this, you will know that "America is great, because America is good; and if America ever ceases to be good, America will cease to be great."

REPORT OF KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION 18TH VOLUNTARY CAMPAIGN

To the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Alabama:

The Committee for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation Voluntary Campaign

respectfully submits the following report:

Contributions received through the 11th week of the campaign which ended February 14, 1986, total \$3,573.89. Based on the total membership of 7,417, this results in an average per capita in the amount of \$.48. As of the end of the 11th week, Alabama ranks in 22nd place.

Reports in possession of your Committee indicate that only eleven of the twenty-

one Commanderies in Alabama have made a contribution.

Sir Knights, through the first five months of fiscal year 1985-1986, which began on July 1, 1985, the Foundation received 25 case applications from Alabama and expended \$51,523.86. Alabama ranks number 7 in case expenditures and number 22 in the Voluntary Campaign. This is a serious discrepancy which your Committee feels should be brought to your attention. The Knights Templar Eye Foundation is a great humanitarian venture which was founded in 1955. It has in the past and will in the future approve every qualified applicant for assistance in the preservation of eyesight.

We still have March and April left in the Campaign which is adequate time for each Commandery to develop a project to bring in funds for this very worthy cause. Remember that Life Memberships, Associate Patron, and Patron Memberships to this fund all count. Only Knights Templar are eligible to purchase Life Memberships at \$30.00 each; however, anyone, whether or not he is a member of our great fraternity, may purchase an Associate Patron, or Patron Membership at \$50.00 and \$100.00 respectively. Essentially the only items which do not count toward this campaign are wills, bequests, Grand Commander's Club, and Grand Master's Club contributions.

Let's go back to our respective Commanderies and get behind this great cause.



ADDRESS OF SIR KNIGHT CHARLES R. NEUMANN, RIGHT EMINENT GRAND RECORDER OF THE GRAND ENCAMPMENT

Right Eminent Sir Knight Charles R. Neumann began by praising Sir Knights George W. Sorrell and Thomas W. Mann for their years of service to the Grand Encampment. He further stated, "A lot of the states and Sir Knights think **The Educational Foundation** rules can be changed just by sending in a recommendation. The Educational Foundation Committee meets on Friday, prior to the start of the Triennial. All Sir Knights are welcome to attend and speak on any subject pertaining to the rules and regulations of the Educational Foundation. This meeting is where the rules are changed. We have been asked to raise the interest rates on our loans. The Grand Encampment doesn't oppose this action, but it is for you, the Sir Knights, to vote this change.

Where **The Eye Foundation** is concerned, we are very proud of your efforts. I am sure Alabama will surpass last year's Campaign. You are one of the leading recipients in cases and dollars spent from the Eye Foundation. We do not ask you to replace those dollars one for one. That would be an impossible task, but we do ask that you redouble your endeavors to publicize the Eye Foundation and the Voluntary Campaign. The Campaign was not set up to get into each of your wallets and checkbooks. It was designed originally so that as a Commandery you could have projects. Projects that would bring in the community. This would make them aware of the fact that the Eye Foundation and Commanderies exist, and through that project, to raise funds for the Eye Foundation. A lot of Commanderies throughout the country have used pancake and sausage breakfasts, dancer, many recognized and accepted means of raising funds in which the community could participate. We want you to start projects, get your towns involved. If you do that, your successes will be unsurpassable.

Each and every one of us could set aside \$30.00 each year and become a Life Sponsor. You can save yourself \$1.00 per year in assessments and also assure the Eye Foundation of being able to continue their great efforts. This year we will spend over 4 million dollars in cases and research. A panel composed of six distinguished doctors from all over the country meets periodically to make the decisions for the Foundation grants - the doctors and locations where the Foundation's Research funds will be spent. Some of these doctors feel we should not pay

any doctor for performing these eye surgeries. We are not in a position to ask doctors for free surgical work, but the panel feels as doctors, that the research money we provide, should be ample reason for doctors to do this surgery free of charge since all doctors benefit from our research. We believe this also. We will gear our future research to the youth, hoping to prevent some of the eye problems. We hope you will continue to be proud of the Foundation and continue to support it.

You should also be proud of **The Knight Templar Magazine** as we are. We feel it is the one source of communication between our members that goes out every month. Your two page supplement should be used for facts that pertain to what is going on in Alabama today and two months from now. It doesn't do any good to write of a Festival after it is over. Use your supplement to advertise the event at least two months in advance so members can invite candidates to attend. If you will cooperate by sending information to us in time to be published, it can save your Commanderies thousands of dollars in communication costs. Use it to bring the word of your Grand Commandery to your Sir Knights. It is each of our responsibility to make the magazine the best tool we have. If you have any news articles you would like to see in the general portion of the magazine, get them to us and we will try to include them.

Just such an article would be Sir Knight Thomas W. Mann's Report of the **Patriotic Activities Committee.** It was well written and showed a lot of heart. Sir Knights, the Patriotic activities do not start and end with the report here today. It is our job to carry them through to each of our Commanderies, to remind our Sir Knights we live in the greatest land ever created. We have the greatest government ever created; we respect the office of the presidency and the government. I

say to you, wave that flag proudly.

Our Holy Land Pilgrimage is now in its 10th Anniversary, and we have 26 ministers touring Israel now, rededicating themselves to God and Jesus Christ. You should be proud of that fact even if you have not sent a minister in the past, the Grand Encampment has, through other states' contributions. There have been 163 ministers who have made that trip and have come back rededicated to the principles of the Christian religion. We are a Christian organization. Never forget

that, Sir Knights.

Each and every one of us is concerned about **Membership**. Membership is each of our responsibility. You should be looking always for Masons that have not received the York Rite, and tell them what a wonderful rite we have. Tell them about the Commandery, how proud you are to be a member, and get those brothers knighted. More important, however, is preserving the members we have. We cannot do anything about the deaths, but dimits and suspensions are our responsibility. We should not be so eager to suspend our Sir Knights without first contacting them. We should find out why that Sir Knight has not paid his dues, what have we done wrong that he feels he can do without the Commandery. You, the Grand Officers, have taken on a great responsibility, one I know you will be able to handle. You must look throughout your state and help the Commanderies hold on to their members.

Another source of doing away with suspensions is **Life Memberships**. The money from these Life Memberships is put into a Perpetual Fund. The interest earned from this fund is paid to the Commanderies. Even if one of our members passes away, the Commanderies continue to receive the interest from that fund. **Dual memberships** is another way of getting new members. Many of our Sir Knights move. These people should be sought out. Most states have dual memberships. The Grand Encampment will provide you with a list of the sojourners in your area if you would write us about it. Contact those Sir Knights and invite them to visit your Commanderies. Make them happy. We often forget those Sir Knights who have moved away, and this is one of the reasons we have suspensions. Let's communicate. Through communication we will create activity.

I am very proud to have been selected to represent our Grand Master, Donald H. Smith, in Alabama. Karla and I appreciate your warm hospitality and I hope to

In 1963 he was appointed Grand Representative of Mississippi near the Grand Chapter of Alabama. He received the Grand Chapter Medal of Honor in 1972, served as Grand Chaplain of the Grand Chapter 1972-1973, and served as Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of Alabama 1983-1984.



First Annual Conclave was held in Montgomery, Alabama, on Friday, November 30, 1860.

Grand Commandery Office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder in 1962.

At the Annual Conclave, April, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus, and the Annual Conclave date changed from April, each year, to last Monday in February, to correspond with Grand Chapter and Grand Council

As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.

On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office moved to 3621 South Fifth Avenue, Birmingham.

September, 1979, Grand York Rite Office moved to 55041/2 North First Avenue, Birmingham, 35212.

On May 16, 1980, James A. Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon, resigned.

At the Annual Conclave, February, 1981, Hoyt McClendon was elected Grand Treasurer Emeritus.

CHRONOLOGY

Titles of Meetings and Dates of Bodies Composed Exclusively of Masons.

The ordinary Calendar, or vulgar era, is not generally used by Freemasons in dating their official documents. They have one peculiar to themselves, differing according to their various Rites.

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS in all parts of the World, add 4,000 years to the Christian era, calling it Anno Lucis—Year of Light; abbreviated A.L. (This fact has a symbolic reference, not because they believe Freemasonry is, but that the principles and light of the institution are coeval with the creation.) (See below.) F&AM Lodges hold "Communications."

ROYAL ARCH MASONS date from the building of the second Temple—530 B.C. Their style is, therefore, Anno Inventionis—A. Inv.—in the year of the discovery. Royal Arch Chapters hold "Convocations."

ROYAL AND SELECT MASONS date from the completion of Solomon's Temple 1000 B.C. Their style is Anno Depositionis—A. Dep.—in the year of Deposit. Royal and Select Councils hold "Assemblies."

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR date from the organization of the Order in 1118 A.D. Their style is, therefore, Anno Ordinia—A.E.—in the year of the Order. Knights Templar Commanderies hold "Conclaves."

ORDER OF THE HIGH PRIESTHOOD dates from the blessing of Abraham by the High Priest Melchezadak, which occurred 1914 B.C. Their style is Anno Benedistionis—A.B.—in year of the Blessing. Councils of Annointed High Priest hold "Convocations."

ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE MASONS use the Jewish Calendar, which adds 3760 to the Christian era, styled Anno Mundi—A.M.—year of the World. Or, they sometimes use the Hebrew year which begins on the seventeenth of September, or feast of Tisri, using the initials A.H.—Anno Hebraico.

TEMPLES, A.A.O.N. MYSTIC SHRINE: Each thirty years from the Hejira, or July 15th, A.D. 602 constitutes a cycle. Nineteen of these years contain 355 days, Eleven, 356.

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

ANCIENT CRAFT MASONS — Add 4,000 years.

Thus: 1986 + 4,000 = A.L. 5986

ROYAL ARCH MASONS — Add 530 years.

Thus: 1986 + 530 = A. Inv. 2516

ROYAL AND SELECT MASTERS — Add 1,000 years.

Thus: 1986 + 1,000 = A. Dept. 2986

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR — Subtract 1,118 years.

Thus: 1986 + 1,118 = A. O. 868

ORDER OF HIGH PRIESTHOOD — Add 1,913 years.

Thus: 1986 + 1,913 = A. B. 3899

SCOTTISH RITE MASONS — Add 3,760 years.

Thus: 1986 + 3,760 = A. M. 5746
