**ADDRESS OF MOST ILLUSTRIOUS GRAND MASTER
JOSEPH D. BRACKIN
1985-1986**

It is indeed a pleasure to extend to each member of the Grand Council a warm, fraternal, and "down home" welcome, as we open the One Hundred and Forty-Eighth Annual Assembly of the Grand Council of Alabama.

To our Distinguished Guests who have honored us by their presence, we extend the warm hospitality and fraternal greetings of our Grand Council and hope their attendance here will be both pleasant and long remembered.

I am most happy to welcome Right Illustrious Companion Hayden M. Carmichael, District Deputy General Grand Master, Southeast Region of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International, and personal representative of Most Illustrious Companion Bernard F. Mandelbaum, Most Puissant General Grand Master of the General Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters, International.

In conformity to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama, Article VI, Section 1, my report is as follows:

STATE OF THE CRAFT

Our Rite is flourishing in northeast Alabama due to several companions making a system of visitation and shared ritualistic work a success. The rest of us should take a lesson from Anniston, Gadsden, Fort Payne, and Piedmont.

Companions, there are 61,227 Master Masons in the Grand Jurisdiction of Alabama and only 5,607 of them belonged to a Council as of December 31, 1984. The fields are deep with grain and the harvest is ready.

VISITATIONS

As I have already stated, I was not able to visit every Council in Alabama this year. I was honored to represent the Grand Council of Alabama at the Grand Assemblies of South Carolina, North Carolina, Georgia, Mississippi, Florida, and Kentucky. In all my travels within Alabama and to the other Grand Jurisdictions, old acquaintances were renewed and new friendships were formed. As your Illustrious Grand Master, I was well received and many honors were bestowed upon me. After eighteen years of diligent pursuit, I was honored to receive the Super Excellent Masters Degree in Brundidge Council last August.

NECROLOGY

Almighty God in his infinite love and wisdom has blessed our Grand Council line this year with good health and our ranks remain intact. Companion William H. Ealy was hospitalized awhile but is now recovered and well again. It is my sad duty to report the loss of Most Illustrious Past Grant Master, Troy J. Roberts, (1972-1973). 

I have examined the statements of assets, liabilities and fund balance of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama, Birmingham, Alabama, as of December 31, 1985 and 1984, and the related statements of revenue, expenses and changes in fund balance for the years then ended. My examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1, the organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements; consequently, certain revenue and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present financial position and results of operations in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In my opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly the assets, liabilities and fund balance arising from cash transactions of the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Alabama, Birmingham, Alabama, as of December 31, 1985 and 1984, and the revenue collected and the expenses paid during the years then ended, on the basis of accounting described in Note 1, which basis has been applied in a manner consistent with that of the preceding year.

My examinations were made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the basic financial statements taken as a whole. The information included on schedules 1 and 2, although not considered necessary for a fair presentation of the assets, liabilities and fund balance arising from cash transactions and revenue collected and expenses paid, is presented by the organization as a supplement to the financial statements taken as a whole.

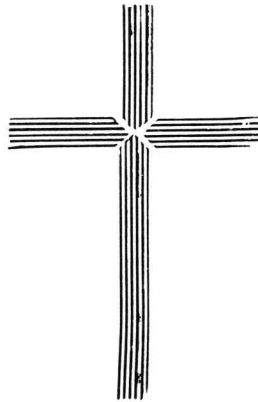

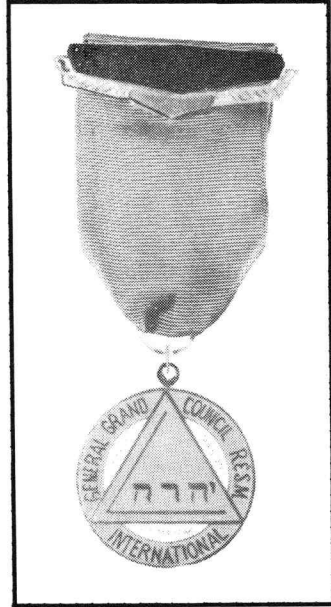

- a. The Grand Council did not meet in the year 1840.
- b. The Grand Council met in 1842 but neither the printed proceedings nor original records show that any officers were elected.
- c. In the year 1849 a new office was created called "Grand Thrice Illustrious," ranking next to Deputy Grand Master, but in 1872 the office was abolished. The following were elected "Grand Thrice Illustrious": In 1849, J. McCaleb Wiley, in 1850, J. McCaleb Wiley; in 1851, William P. Chilton; in 1852, William A. Taylor; in 1853, Henry S. - d. The Grand Council did not meet in the years 1861, 1862 and 1863.
- e. For want of a quorum, the Grand Council held no meeting in the year 1886.

- k. On September 16, 1960 following resignation of Companion T. L. Cochran, Companion Gordon L. Evatt, was appointed Grand Recorder.
- l. On December 1, 1960, Companion Varna A. Rushton was appointed Grand Recorder to succeed Gordon L. Evatt, resigned.
- m. Grand York Rite Office moved from Montgomery to Birmingham after election of Thomas W. Oliver as Grand Recorder.
- n. At the Annual Assembly, February, 1973, Thomas W. Mann was elected Grand Recorder. Thomas W. Oliver was elected Grand Recorder Emeritus.
- o. Annual Assembly date changed to last Monday in February.
- p. As proof of continual effort of Alabama to promote York Rite Unity, the first combined meeting of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, and Grand Commandery was held in February, 1974.
- q. On November 1, 1974, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 3621 South 5th Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35222.
- r. On October 1, 1979, the Grand York Rite Office was moved to a new location at 5504½ North 1st Avenue, Birmingham, Alabama 35212.
- s. On May 16, 1980, James A Kile was appointed Grand Treasurer to succeed Hoyt McClendon, resigned.
