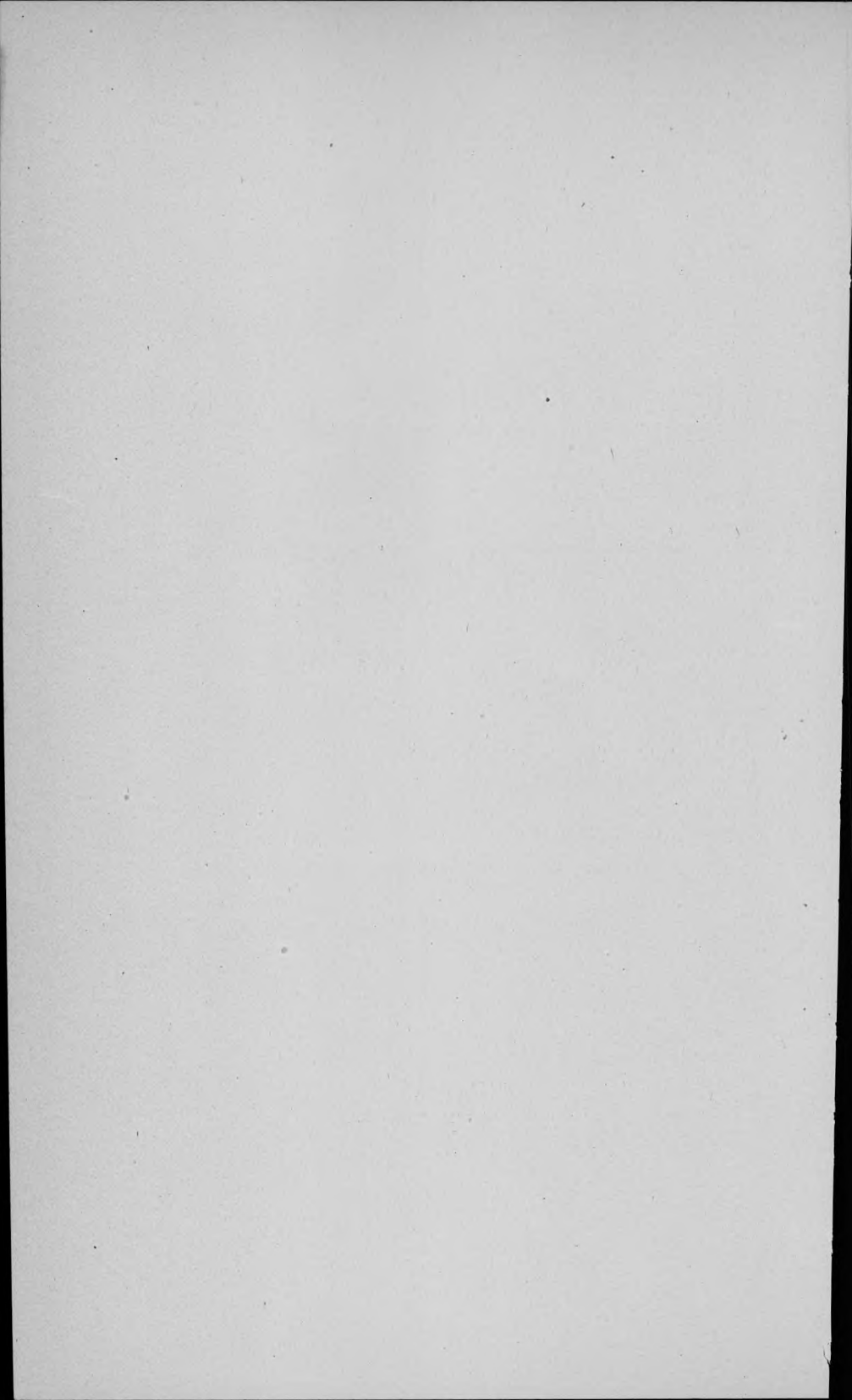

Dec. 7, A. L. 5841, R. A. M. 2371. }

The M. E. Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the State of Alabama, held its Grand Annual Convocation pursuant to its Constitution; and was opened in due form, solemn prayer and invocation being addressed to the Throne of Grace.

Since the last convocation of the M. E. Grand Chapter, the following subordinate Chapters have not availed themselves of the resolution then adopted, granting them sixty days to report and pay their dues, viz: Clinton No. 8, Clinton No. 9, Tuscumbia No. 10, Leighton No. 14, Hayneville No. 15.

The account of the Grand Secretary is also presented, showing a balance in his hands of twenty-three 25-100 dollars. He also reports the sum of one hundred dollars, Grand Chapter

funds, in the possession of M. E. A. B. Dawson, G. H. P., received by him for dispensation of Montgomery Chapter.

Comp. Hicks, from the Committee on Charters under dispensation, made the following report: concurred in.

Your Committee, to whom was referred the proceedings and by-laws of Chapters under dispensation, beg leave to report—That they have examined the proceedings of Montgomery Chapter, and find them neatly kept in a well bound book; and that their work is regular, their by-laws good, and therefore recommend that a Charter be granted them.

As it relates to Washington Chapter No. 24, at Columbus, Miss., we find that the Grand High Priest of this Grand Chapter has not conformed to the Constitution of the General Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the U. S., by forming a Chapter out of the limits of the State; and as this has been, no doubt, an oversight in him, your committee would respectfully recommend that said Chapter cease to work until our Grand Secretary can send on their petition, with the funds received for said dispensation, to one of the General Grand Officers of the General Grand Chapter of the U. S., and procure a dispensation; also an act legalizing the work heretofore done by said Chapter.

Resolved, That the Charter heretofore granted to Montgomery Chapter No. 22, be renewed, without any fee except the Secretary's; also, that the amount paid for a dispensation by said Chapter, be refunded back, exclusive of the Gr. Sec'y's fee.

Comp. Purdom, from the Committee on Foreign Correspondence, submitted their report; which was received and concurred in.

The Committee on Foreign Correspondence beg leave to report—That they have examined the various documents submitted to them by the Grand Secretary, consisting of the proceedings of the various Grand Chapters in the United States, and find nothing in them demanding the particular attention of the Grand Chapter.

They appear to be working in harmony and concert; and your Committee feel no hesitation in asserting that Free Masonry will soon regain that proud station from which she was so ruthlessly hurled.

The Committee would beg leave to recommend the continuation of the correspondence of this Grand Chapter with the various Grand Chapters of the U. S.—All of which is respectfully submitted.

Whereas, Tuscumbia Chapter No. 10, made no returns to this Grand Chapter in the year 1840, and has made a return to this Grand Chapter at its present session for the year 1841 only, omitting the return which should have come up in 1840:

Therefore, resolved, That the said Chapter shall be allowed sixty days to send up the return heretofore omitted, and that the Grand Secretary be authorized to receive the same.

Comp. Fletcher from the Committee on Accounts made the following report, which was laid upon the table for further consideration.

The Committee on Accounts beg leave to report—That they have examined the accounts of Comps. Grand Secretary and Treasurer, and find them correct, agreeably to the vouchers laid before them; and find a balance in the hands of the Gr. Secretary of twenty-three 25-100 dollars, and in the hands of the Grand Treasurer, five dollars.

Your Committee also find a report of the Special Committee appointed at our last convocation, to whom was referred the subject of ascertaining the amount due to this Grand Chapter by Comp. J. C. Hicks, find the sum due by him to be two hundred and ninety dollars.

Your Committee also beg leave to report, that Clinton Chapter No. 8, Clinton No. 9, Leighton No. 14, and Hayneville No. 15, have not availed themselves of the resolution of the last convocation, granting them sixty days to make their returns.

Your Committee also find in the report of our Grand Secretary the sum of one hundred dollars in the hands of our M. E. G. H. Priest, A. B. Dawson, received for the dispensation of Montgomery Chapter.
